Environmental Education



The mission of the Freshwater Folk Festival is to promote understanding, appreciation, and conservation of freshwater resources. All of earth's creatures, including humans, depend on a quality source of clean, fresh water for survival. Unfortunately, when the Environmental Protection Agency assessed the water quality for 699,946



river miles (19% of the nationwide total) in the United States in 2000, they designated over 300,000 of those miles as either threatened or impaired. Nearly 70% of the river miles in the state of West Virginia also have been designated as either threatened or impaired for fish, shellfish and wildlife protection. Consequently, conservation of freshwater resources is one of the most important environmental issues we face in West Virginia and nationwide. To help promote understanding and appreciation of this critical issue, the Friends and staff of the White Sulphur Springs National Fish Hatchery have brought together a dedicated team of biologist, environmental educators, business owners and concerned citizens from the state of West Virginia and beyond to help get the word out. We have numerous hands-on activities and educational demonstrations planned covering a wide array of topics including freshwater mussel biology, river ecology, cave ecology, water quality, monitoring your local stream, starting your own watershed association, making your home or business environmentally friendly, environmentally conscious eating, fly fishing and many others. Fun Fish Facts

Fish with no EYES!

Did you know there are fish with no eyes? They are called Blind Cave Fish. In a cave, where it is dark all the time, eyes are not necessary. In fact, eyes can be vulnerable to injury and require food energy to maintain. So, a cave fish with no eyes can live longer with less

They bounce sound waves off the objects around them much like a bat that flies around in the dark. Blind cave fish also have sensory cells in their skin that detect movements in the water nearby. The lack of color in the photo above is also a result of living in the dark. Predators cannot see them and the sun cannot burn them so there is really no need for camouflage or pigmentation.
