Roles: The function of the Dry-Forest Landscape Work Group is to assist field units with implementing the northern spotted owl recovery plan (**mainly recovery actions 6, 7, 9 & 10**) in dry forests of the east Cascades and California Cascades through provision of technical and scientific expertise and products. Refinement of roles will occur at first workgroup meeting.

Geographic area: The East Cascades provinces of Washington and Oregon, and the California Cascades province of California within the range of the northern spotted owl

Members: A mixture of federal, state, tribal, academic and NGO technical experts. This group is in the process of confirming its membership.

Subgroups: None yet

Key questions: More specific questions will be defined by the group.

- 1) How best to implement Recovery Actions 6, 7, 9 and part of 10?
- 2) How to ensure we are complementing ongoing research and management actions?
