



Common Name: Humped Tree Snail (akaleha')

Scientific Name: *Partula gibba*

Description: Humped Tree Snail is white to brown, apex colored rose-red, translucent, and almost 1 in (17 mm) long, with 4 ½ whorls. They occur in cool, shaded forest, and feed on dead or decaying plant material. Like other Partulid snails, they give birth to live young.

Status: : Known from Guam, Rota, Aguiguan, Saipan, Tinian, Anatahan, Sarigan, Alamagan, and Pagan; currently from Guam, Rota, Saipan, Alamagan, and Pagan.

Threats: Agriculture and urban development, rats, pigs, water buffalo, cattle, deer, nonnative plants, fire, typhoons, collection, flatworms.
