Wildlife Photography Blind

Scheduling

- The photography blind is available by reservation only. You may reserve the blind for a maximum of 2 people in your party.
- There is no charge to use the blind. A refuge entrance fee may apply in the future.
- The blind is open on Monday-Sunday, year-round. The blind may be reserved from dawn to 12:00 p.m.; from 1:00 p.m. to dusk; or all day from dawn to dusk.
- Reservations must be made two weeks in advance. Advance reservations are accepted by sending an email to tualatinriver@fws.gov or by mailing a written request to the refuge at the address below. Include your name, address, phone number, email address and the date(s) and time(s) you wish to schedule. If corresponding by email, please enter “Wildlife Photo Blind” in the subject line.
- Refuge staff will notify you by email, postal mail, or phone call to confirm your reservation. If the date you have requested is unavailable, you will be given the option to choose another date or be put on a waiting list for your original choice.
- Please contact the refuge if you must cancel your reservation, so that others may schedule the blind.
- Reservations are taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Up to 4 advance reservations can be made up to one year ahead of time.
- “Last minute” reservations can be made up to 7 days ahead of time by calling the refuge during business hours, Monday-Thursday 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Using the Blind—things you need to know

- The refuge is open daily from dawn to dusk.
- Park at the main visitor entrance at 19255 SW Pacific Hwy (99W), Sherwood, OR.
- A year-round walking trail leaves from the main parking lot. Near the end of this 1 mile long trail is a short, 0.2 mile long spur trail that leads to the blind. The year-round trail and photo blind trail are relatively flat and fully accessible. Photographers must use the established trails to access the blind. **No off-trail use is allowed.** A series of seasonal trails are open from May 1st – September 30th; you may use these trails to access the blind during these times. The seasonal trails are uneven, gravel roads.
- Approach the blind quietly and slowly. You will minimize wildlife disturbance and maximize your wildlife photography opportunities.
- Walking only—no jogging, driving, or bicycling. Pets are not allowed anywhere on the refuge.
- Visitors needing special assistance accessing the blind will be accommodated. Call the refuge for more details.
- Restrooms are located in the parking area only. There are no restrooms along the trail. Please plan accordingly. If you take a break, please leave and return to the blind quietly.
- All refuge regulations posted at trailheads and along trails must be observed.
