Hunting Regulations — Juniper Canyon and Stateline Units

Hunting is permitted in accordance with state regulations (Oregon – www.dfw.state.or.us/resources/; Washington – wdfw.wa.gov/hunting/regulations/) and special refuge regulations.

Open to Hunting – Goose, duck, coot, snipe, dove, all upland game birds (excluding turkey), and deer.

Closed to Hunting – All other species of wildlife not listed are protected. Protected species include, but are not limited to, rabbits, elk, bear, snakes, raven, crow, coyote, porcupine, rabbits, and turkey.

Deer Hunting – Deer hunting is allowed on the Juniper Canyon and Stateline Units.

Days – The Juniper Canyon and Stateline Units are open to the lawful pursuit of the above listed species 7 days a week during state seasons.

Hours – The refuge is open from 1-1/2 hours before legal hunt time to 1-1/2 hours after legal hunt time.

General Public Entry – For non-hunters, the refuge is open 7 days a week from sunrise to sunset.

Firearms & Ammunition – Firearms may only be discharged in accordance with FWS regulations (50 CFR 27.42) and refuge-specific regulations (50 CFR Part 32). On the Juniper Canyon and Stateline Units, hunting with modern firearms, shotguns, muzzleloaders, and archery is permitted. Only federally approved non-toxic shot may be used or possessed, with the exception of lead slugs and modern firearms.

Vehicle Travel – All vehicles, including bicycles, are restricted to designated motorized routes of travel and parking areas.

Dogs – Dogs must be kept on leash, except during the lawful pursuit of game during legal seasons.

Details on Specific Hunting Areas

Juniper Canyon and Stateline Units – Hunting is free-roam; however, be aware the area is a network of lands owned by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management, and private landowners. Review the map closely to avoid trespassing. Only portable or temporary blinds constructed of non-living natural materials are permitted; permanent blinds are not permitted.

Selected Prohibited Activities

- The use or possession of alcoholic beverages while hunting
- Baiting of any wildlife, trapping, or netting
- Fires
- Overnight parking and camping
- Littering (including empty shotgun hulls)
- Use of ATVs and other off-road vehicles
- Commercial guiding for hunting
- Abandoning, discarding, or otherwise leaving personal property unattended
- Target shooting
- Discharging any firearm within 1/4 mile of any maintained building
- Trespassing
- Falconry
