

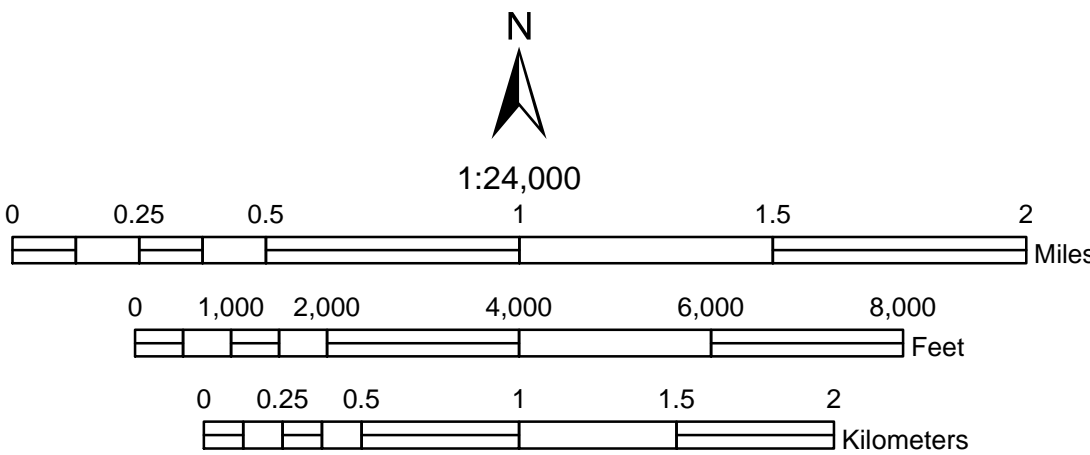
JOHN H. CHAFEE COASTAL BARRIER RESOURCES SYSTEM

Snake Creek Unit FL-40

This map was produced by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service from a map dated March 18, 2016, that was made effective on December 21, 2018, via Public Law 115-358. The boundaries of the John H. Chafee Coastal Barrier Resources System (CBRS) on this map are identical to the boundaries on the map adopted by Public Law 115-358. This map supersedes all prior maps depicting the CBRS boundaries in this location.

The seaward side of the CBRS unit includes the entire sand-sharing system, including the beach and nearshore area. The sand-sharing system of CBRS units is normally defined by the 30-ft bathymetric contour. In large coastal embayments and the Great Lakes, the sand-sharing system is defined by the 20-ft bathymetric contour or a line approximately one mile seaward of the shoreline, whichever is nearer the coastal barrier.
