LEOPARD HUNTING AT SENTINEL RANCH AND BORDER RIDGE FARM, BEITBRIDGE, ZIMBABWE

Sentinel Limpopo Safaris is fully registered with the Zimbabwe Tourism Authority under Reg. No. HOP(0101) as a Hunting Operator.

We are also members of the Safari Operators Association of Zimbabwe and abide by the SOAZ Code of Ethics in the conduct of our hunting safaris. We use freelance Zimbabwean licensed professional hunters

We abide by the Parks & Wildlife Act of Zimbabwe CHAPTER 20:14 and the laws of Zimbabwe.

COMPANY VISION & OBJECTIVES

(From our 2020-24 Tender Document dated 8 November 2019 to the Beitbridge Rural District Council for the Sentinel Ranch Concession. Re-awarded January 2020)

VISION

It is the vision of Border Ridge (1985) P/L, trading as Sentinel Limpopo Safaris, to maintain and enhance its position as a recognised world-class sustainable hunting and photographic safari destination on Sentinel Ranch, as *the core wildlife area* of the Greater Mapungubwe Transfrontier Conservation Area (GMTFCA), for the benefit of the Pingwe Safari Project and the broader communities of Maramani, Masera and Machatuta - our neighbours and friends - and by so doing, to create a sustainable wildlife-based economy for the socio-economic upliftment of the Rural Community in SW Zimbabwe, in line with the Beitbridge District Strategic Plan (2016-2020) and the Integrated Development Plan of the GMTFCA.

OBJECTIVE

Our objective is to protect, conserve, care for and manage the asset that is Sentinel Ranch: its wildlife, its natural environment, as well as the human, social, historical, and palaeontological capital it contains for the ongoing benefit of the local Beitbridge District community, and our regional and international visitors for generations to come.

We conduct leopard hunts on three properties:

- **Sentinel Ranch (32,5116)**, a former private game ranch, now CAMPFIRE area managed under the appropriate authority of the Beitbridge Rural District Council on behalf of 150 Community Beneficiaries resident in the three neighbouring wards of Maramani, Masera and Machatuta. The property was purchased in 1952 by the Bristow family as a cattle ranch and returned to wildlife production in 1980, where wildlife and tourism has been the sole source of income since. It was acquired by the State in 2003 during the Zimbabwe Land Reform Programme, but the then managing director of Sentinel Ranch P/L, Digby Bristow, was invited to remain on Sentinel as the CAMFIRE concessionaire to hunt and manage the property. (Bristow has been managing the property and conducting hunting safaris here since 1980.) Recently, his company, Sentinel Limpopo Safaris, successfully retained the concession for the next 5-year period (2020-24). Notably, Sentinel Ranch is *the core wildlife area in the Zimbabwean component of the proposed Greater Mapungubwe Transfrontier Conservation Area covering the confluence of the Shashe and Limpopo Rivers*. The Treaty for this TFCA is expected to be signed by the governments of Zimbabwe, South Africa and Botswana later this year. The property encompasses vast areas of diversified habitats, including dense riverine forests, sandstone hills, mopani woodlands, natural springs and grassland. There are abundant plainsgame species, including impala, eland, giraffe, zebra, kudu, wildebeest, waterbuck, bushbuck, warthogs, bushpig, klipspringers, steenbok and duiker, as well as brown and spotted hyena, and transient lion and African wild dogs. Under the TFCA process, numerous scoping reports in respect of wildlife estimates, biodiversity (fauna and flora), geology, habitat, carrying capacity, etc., have been carried out and are obtainable from the Peace Parks Foundation. Furthermore, a mandatory, professional ecological assessment was carried out by the Zimbabwe National Parks and Wildlife Management Authority in 2015, which justified the annual maximum leopard offtake quota applied for by Sentinel Limpopo Safaris which has remained unchanged: Sentinel Ranch 2; Border Ridge 1; Wape Ranch 1 (see attached 2020 quotas). Since 2016 we have availed our leopard offtake records to the ZNPWMA Leopard Survey, where records from the last 5 years show that we have consistently taken excellent leopard trophies annually, ranging from 15 ½ inches to 17 inches.
- **Border Ridge Farm (460ha)** – congruous with Sentinel Ranch, but privately owned) - an intensively game-ranched property where impala (in large numbers), bushbuck, eland, zebra, elephant, kudu, warthog, bushbuck, grysbok, warthogs, bush pig, and transient leopard (off Sentinel Ranch) occur naturally, and where waterbuck and nyala were re-introduced to enhance the “huntability” of the property.
- **Wape Ranch, Mwenezi, Masvingo (7000ha)** - a privately owned property, formally a dilapidated cattle ranch, refurbished and re-fenced to contain a re-introduced herd of 177 African Buffalo in 2014. Currently buffalo number approximately 300, plus other naturally occurring animals (nyala, impala, kudu, grysbok, elephant, warthog, leopard, bushbuck, etc.). The property is heavily wooded, with well-watered riverine areas and rocky hills and outcrops, and good numbers of prey species - ideal habitat for leopard.

TROPHY OFFTAKE

Not only does the consistently large trophy size of our leopard offtake show that our leopard quotas on Sentinel Ranch is sustainable, but we have never had an undersized leopard - by ZNPWA standards – taken and have never been penalized for such. This speaks volumes about sustainable harvesting, availability of large males in the area, and excellent professional hunting and size estimation. Numerous trail camera images of leopards taken at Sentinel, Border Ridge and Wape Ranch over the years support this.



CAMPFIRE PROJECT AT SENTINEL RANCH

Sentinel Limpopo Safaris works hand in hand with the Beneficiary Communities of Maramani, Masera and Machatuta Communal Areas. We actively support the Beitbridge Rural District Council CAMPFIRE office as the Appropriate Authority on Sentinel Ranch, and the communities to whom Sentinel Ranch was allocated. Trophy fees of animals taken at Sentinel Ranch go 100% to CAMPFIRE, the BBRDC and the Community. Daily rates earned by the Operator pay for all anti-poaching activities (currently we have 8 permanent game scouts employed), maintenance of vehicles, equipment, radios and uniforms, fuel and water points.

We have committed to Social Responsibility Programmes in our community including water and classroom development at the Mapani Primary School, fencing at the Masera Secondary School, teachers' accommodation, ablutions, borehole, classroom electrification, and seating for 750 children at the Shashi Primary School; ongoing orphan support; meat sales and donations for public events; we grow cattle fodder for drought relief; we host The Nedbank Tour de Tuli cycle event that raises funds for conservation education in our rural schools; and will soon be giving support to the Peace Park Foundation's Herding 4 Health (intensive cattle management) Programme in the Maramani Communal Land.

Numerous Professional Hunters and past clients can stand witness to the high professional standards we maintain at Sentinel Limpopo Safaris in our approach to sustainable utilization of our wildlife resources and community support.
