Hi Pat. This doesn't appear to be specific to fluid mineral development - so maybe there's more on that? Anyway, a couple of thoughts on the attached:

- 1) It seems like this is consistent with current science, as long as the "appropriate", or "corresponding" (or similar terminology) buffers from the interpreted ranges in the USGS report were applied - maybe we could get that clarified a bit further?
- 2) Haven't seen Attachment X - so am not sure what that is. It could be their mitigation appendix, or maybe the screening criteria? Would be good to understand that also.
