Hi, Ivy. Per my VM, we are seeking an A to the following Q for a Congressional briefing next week:

Q: What is the role of tribes in sage-grouse conservation?

A:

My recommended parameters for the A include:

- Who/how many tribes are in SG range?
- Of those tribes, how many are actively working on SG conservation?
- Of those tribes, what subset has received FWS money to do so?
- What consultation requirements/process will we follow as we conduct our ESA status review?

This need not be exhaustive or Pulitzer winning; just a quick summary of what we know on the above. We need this by 1200 MDT tomorrow (5/2). Thanks in advance, and holler with questions/thoughts.
