The Wyoming Department of Agriculture does not support Cooperator Agency meetings being open to the public in any way. We feel opening these meetings has set a bad precedent for future meetings and NEPA related projects. We would appreciate the opportunity to discuss the reasons why in a different setting and at a later date.

With that said, since you have already opened these preliminary meeting to the public, we feel that you must follow through in good faith and finish discussing the items that were placed in the parking lot. The public should not be present in the ensuing alternative development discussions.

In addition, the agenda discussed in your email does not seem appropriate for the task at hand. We feel the parking lot issues being covered by the sub-groups should be kept to one day, even if the day has to be extended past the 10:00am to 4:00pm time frame (of day 1) to accomplish the task. The development of the preferred alternative should be more important and take the most time and consideration to develop. The preferred alternative is where the rubber meets the road and stands as the back bone to the development of the RMP amendment.

You should notify the public that November 30th will be open to the public to cover any unresolved issues from the previous meetings. The remaining two days should be devoted to the development of the preferred alternative.

Thus we support your #2 (opposed to opening the meetings to the public) but believe your #3 (open to the parking lot issues) is appropriate for this situation regarding the circumstances.
