  - a. No.....Go to #3
  - b. Yes.....No effect. GAES concurrence has been provided.
- 3. The project impacts an area where  $\geq$ 75 acres of southern yellow pine dominated (>50%) forest is present.
  - a. No...... No effect. (Retain habitat survey for records)
  - b. Yes.....Go to #4.
- 4. The pine dominated area has southern yellow pine trees greater than or equal to 30 years of age.
  - a. No......NLAA. Provide supporting documentation (see Information to be provided below).
  - b. Yes.....Contact Fish and Wildlife Service's Georgia Field Office (GAES) for assistance.

## Information to be provided for Endangered Species Act Review

- Project location, outlined on a USGS topographic map.
- Aerial photographs of the area, with pine habitats outlined on the photo.
- Photographs of each pine habitat, keyed to the areas outlined on the aerial photos.
- RCW survey report, if conducted.
