Union Slough NWR Taking Bids for Hay Harvest

Union Slough National Wildlife Refuge is soliciting sealed bids (per harvested ton) for hay harvest on one tract of land to be harvested in August 2022. The tract is located in Kossuth County as follows: In Ramsey Township: Sec 29.

Bidders must place bids on forms provided by the Refuge and submit them in a sealed envelope labeled "Union Slough Haying." Bid forms and maps are available at the refuge headquarters and on the Union Slough NWR website at https://www.fws.gov/refuge/union_slough/. Applicants must be 18 years of age or older. Bid forms must be received at the refuge headquarters by close of business (4 pm) on Tuesday, August 16th, 2022 to be eligible. The bid opening will take place at the refuge headquarters on Wednesday, August 17th, 2022 at 10 am. Bidders are encouraged to attend, but do not need to be present. The successful bidder(s) will be contacted by phone if they are not present. The refuge headquarters is located 6 miles east of Bancroft, Iowa on County Road A-42. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service reserves the right to modify the timing of haying or terminate the SUP if habitat conditions warrant.
2. All equipment for haying, including ATVs and UTVs, must be clean and free of invasives species plant material, including seeds, before entering any Refuge, WPA, or Service easement. The Refuge Manager reserves the right to inspect and deny the use of any equipment/vehicle/horse etc. that appears to contain invasive species plant material or seeds.
3. Only the permittee and/or their authorized agents are allowed on the WPA.
4. Permittee is expected to cut and harvest the entire hay unit. All broken and "piled" hay must be removed from the unit.
5. All haying operations (mowing, raking, baling, bale removal, and equipment removal) must be completed by 9/5/22. All mowing operations must be completed between August 1 and August 31, 2022.
6. The permittee must weigh a minimum of four (4) bales. A certified weight ticket showing the gross and net weight for each load of bales weighed must be submitted along with the Haying Record to Union Slough NWR. All Haying Record forms and weight tickets must be received in the Iowa WMD office by September 30, 2022.
7. All fences, gates, or other structures or facilities damaged or altered must be repaired, restored or replaced per the Refuge Manager's specifications.

Certification: I hereby certify that I have read and, if selected, agree to the permit conditions listed in the bid package. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service reserves the right to reject any or all bids. I further certify that the information submitted in this bid sheet is complete and accurate to the best of my knowledge and belief. I understand that any false statement herein may subject me to the criminal penalties of 18 U.S.C. 1001.

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

Authority: The information requested is authorized by the National Wildlife Refuge System Administration Act (16 U.S.C. 668dd-ee) and the Refuge Recreation Act (16 U.S.C. 460k-460k-4).

Purpose: To collect the applicant's information to process permits allowing for commercial activities such as: guiding hunters, anglers or other outdoor users; commercial filming; agriculture; rental of cabins and trapping while on the National Wildlife Refuge System.
