1. Acres planted to corn will have a target yield of at least 120 bushels per acre, therefore, requiring appropriate inputs of seed population, cultivation, fertilizer and herbicides. Corn must be planted before **May 20th of each year** unless extreme extenuating circumstances occur.
2. Acres planted to beans will have a target yield of at least 40 bushels per acres, therefore, requiring appropriate inputs of seed population, cultivation, fertilizer, and herbicides. Bean fields must be planted as early as conditions allow.
3. Hay can be harvested once yearly, between August 1st and August 15th of each crop year. One cutting will be allowed per year. No storage of bales is allowed on the area.
4. If cooperator is unable to plant designated corn acres to corn in the allotted time frame they must consult with DNR staff prior to planting an alternative crop.
5. The cooperator agrees to certify all crop acres under the term of this lease with the USDA Farm Service Agency before the deadline.
6. All AG fields in the lease shall be planted with end-rows. The adjacent grassland areas shall not be used as turn around areas.
7. Field marker posts are to be respected, if they are damaged, the cooperator will replace/repair the post ASAP. Do not increase field size.
8. Fall tillage is prohibited.
9. An approved Pesticide Use Proposal is required before pesticide application and the permittee is required to follow the associated guidelines contained in the Pesticide Use Proposal. Use of any other chemical (herbicide or pesticide)

without an approved Pesticide Use Proposal will constitute a Refuge violation, and revocation of any Special Use Permit.

10. For habitat restoration the only GMO crops allowed are glyphosate-tollerant corn and soybean seed. For all other purposes, GMO crop use is not allowed.
11. Only conventional crop seed may be used on fields intended for food plots.
12. Permittee is required to report all pesticide use by December 1, annually.
13. Permittee may be required to post fields after pesticide application.
14. Neonicotinoid treated seed **will not** be permitted to be used on any U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service lands including Waterfowl Production Areas.

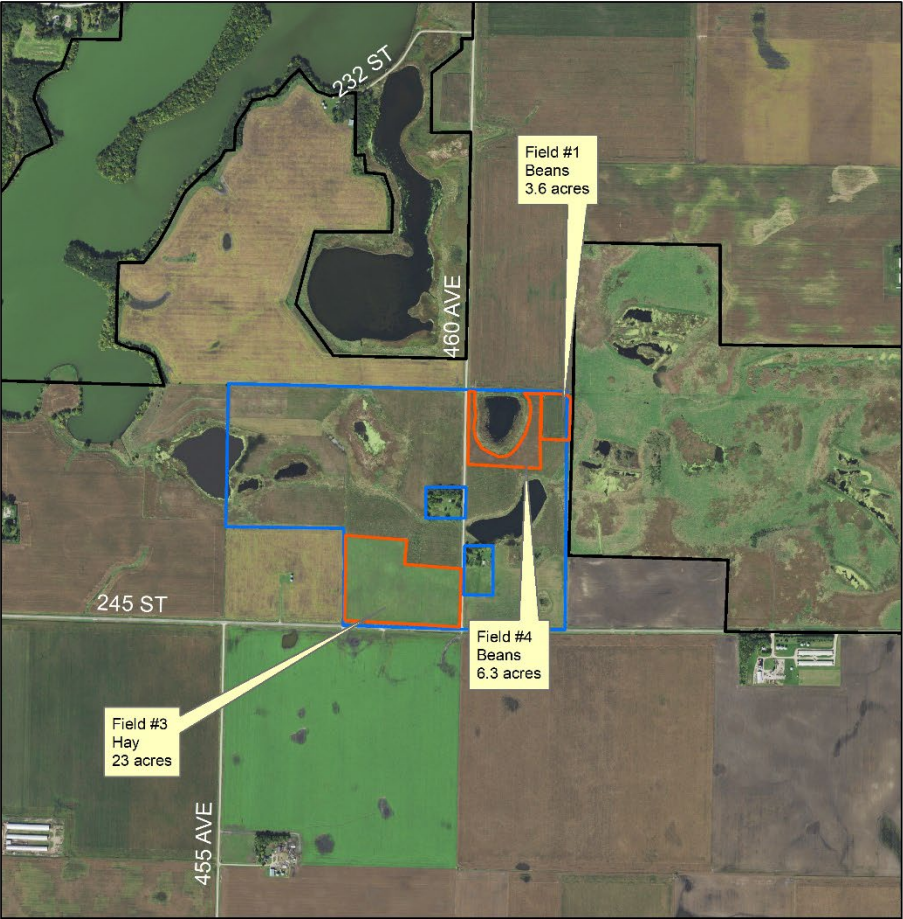

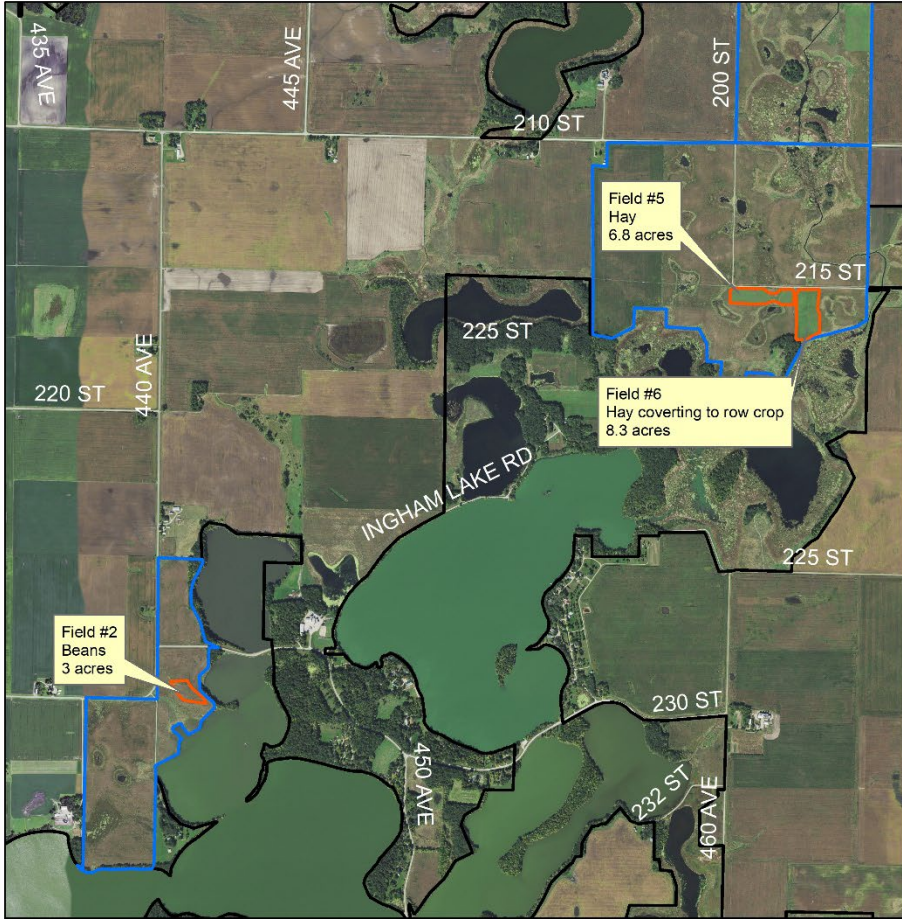

2. The bid will be placed with the SUP Application and mailed or turned in to Agriland Inc. 905 S. Grand Ave. Spencer IA, 51301 by 4:00 p.m. on February 15th, 2023.
3. You will need to evaluate the bid solicitation for each unit and the cropping plan for each of the next year, and place your total bid. This will be your competing bid, and highest bid will be awarded. In the event of a tie bid, the winning bidder will be randomly drawn from the tying bidders.
