Be Prepared for All Weather

Dress for the weather at Kīlauea Point! We recommend bringing sunscreen, a hat, and a refillable waterbottle as most of your time will be outdoors under the sun! Rain gear is also advised most of the year.



Stay with Your Group

Please don't wander alone.



Please Walk and Don't Run

Running is dangerous because you can fall and scrape your knee on the asphalt. Running also scares wildlife.



Take Only Memories

You can take away memories, including photographs and drawings. But plants, birds (including feathers and eggs), and rocks are a part of the refuge. Please leave them so that they can play their role in nature and so that other visitors may enjoy them.

Leave Food and Drink (except for Water) on the Bus

Food can make wildlife sick. Also, the sugars from spilled juice or soda can attract rats that prey on seabirds.




Stay Within the Refuge Boundary Fences

The pali (cliffs) surrounding Kīlauea Point are steep and exposed. The fences serve as a barrier to protect you. Stay on the safe side of the fences and leave the other side for the birds.



Talk Quietly

When we speak quietly, we will see (and hear) more birds.



Leave Only Footprints

Please do not litter. Litter can harm animals at the refuge. All litter belongs in a trashcan.
