Instruction Manual for Installation and Submission of ArcGIS Survey123 Form

Thank you for taking part in the Lake Champlain Angler Diary Program. The data collected in this survey will be used by the Lake Champlain Fish and Wildlife Management Cooperative to assess annual catch rates of salmonids in accordance with the Strategic Plan for Lake Champlain Fisheries and Lake Champlain Landlocked Atlantic Salmon River-run Restoration Plan.

To attain accurate records, we ask anglers:

- 1. Report trips whether fish are caught or not**
- 2) Create a new trip if you begin fishing in a different designated area of the Lake Champlain basin**
- 3) Only submit one entry for all individuals fishing within a group**

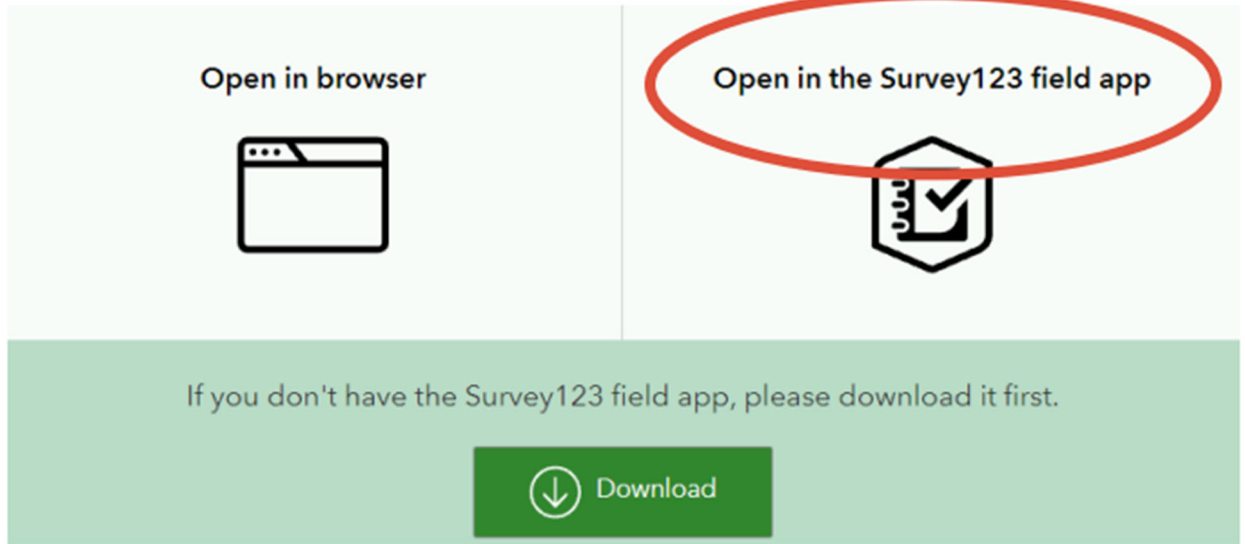
For PC

3. Choose “Open app in the Survey123 field app.”

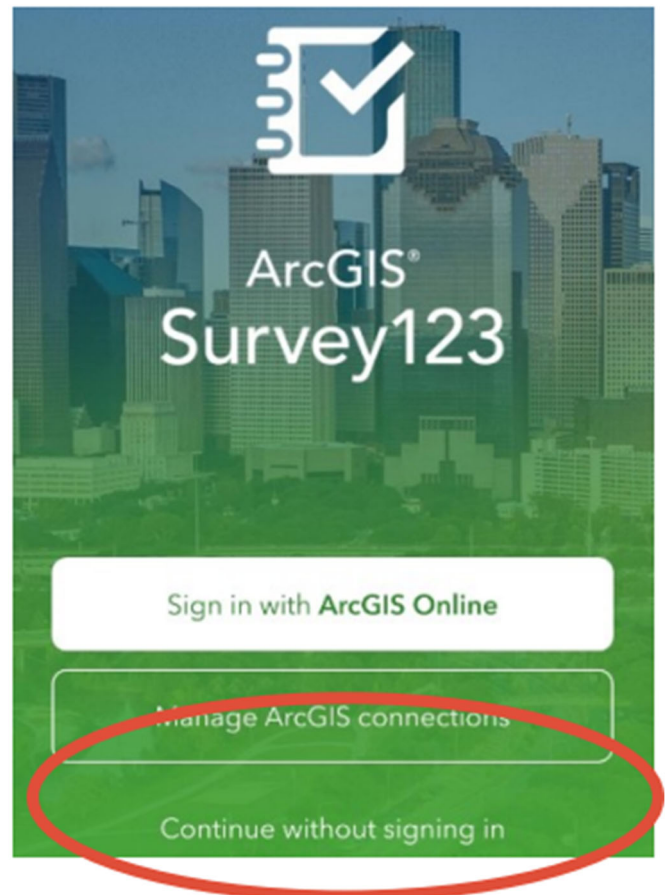


4. When you get this splash screen during the install, click “Continue without signing in”.

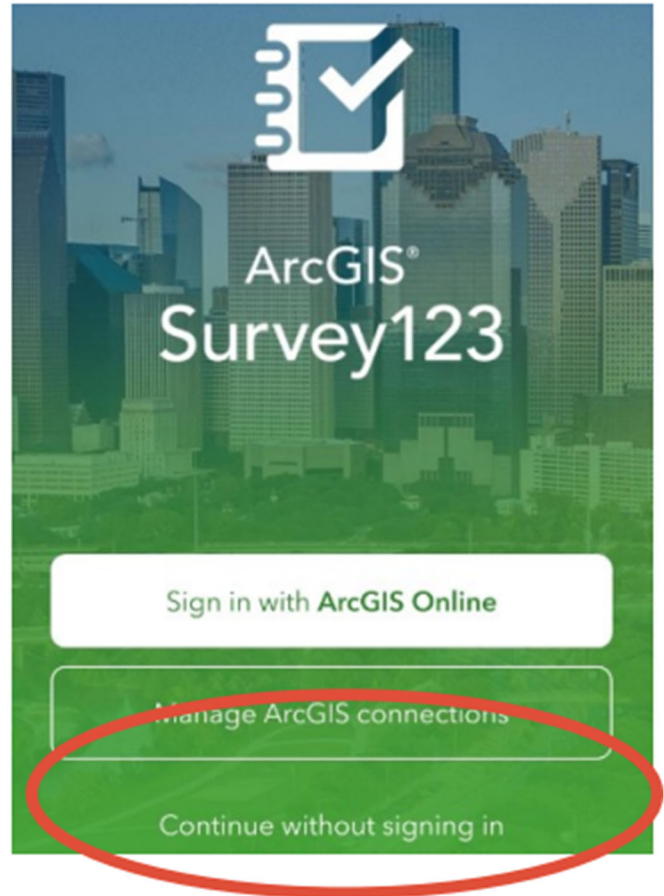

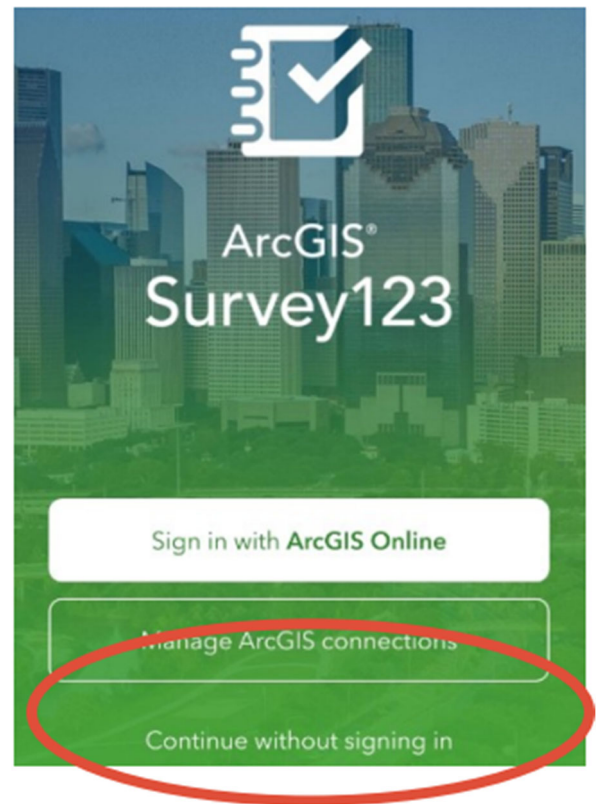

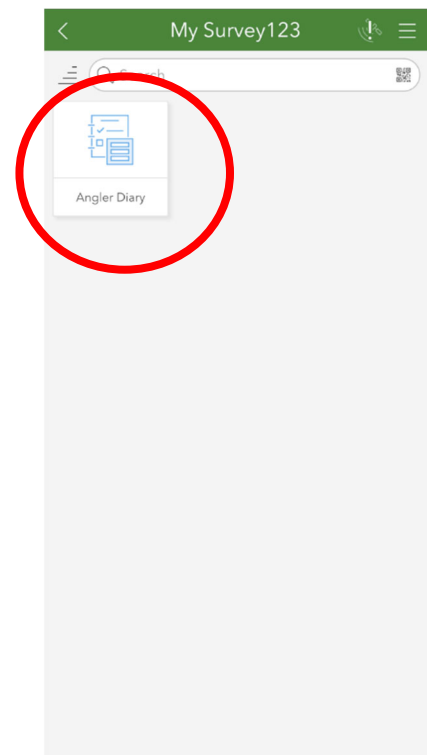


Starting The Application

To attain accurate records, we ask anglers to:

- 1) Report trips whether or not fish are caught;
- 2) Create a new trip if you begin fishing for a different species or start fishing in a different area; and,
- 3) One entry per group, regardless of number of people

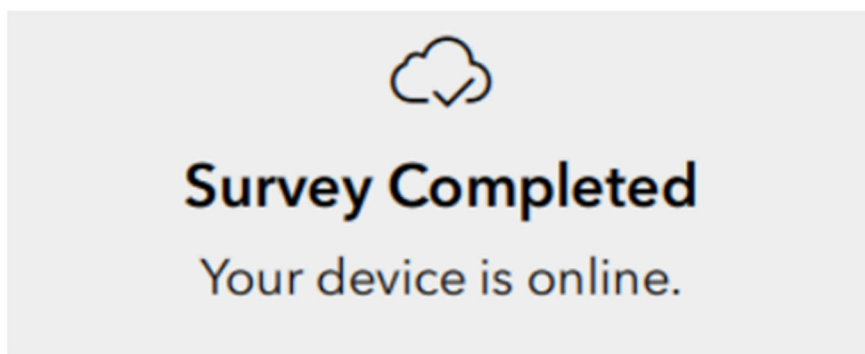



18. Once you have completed your entry, you have the option to send the survey now, continue with the survey, or save it to your outbox.

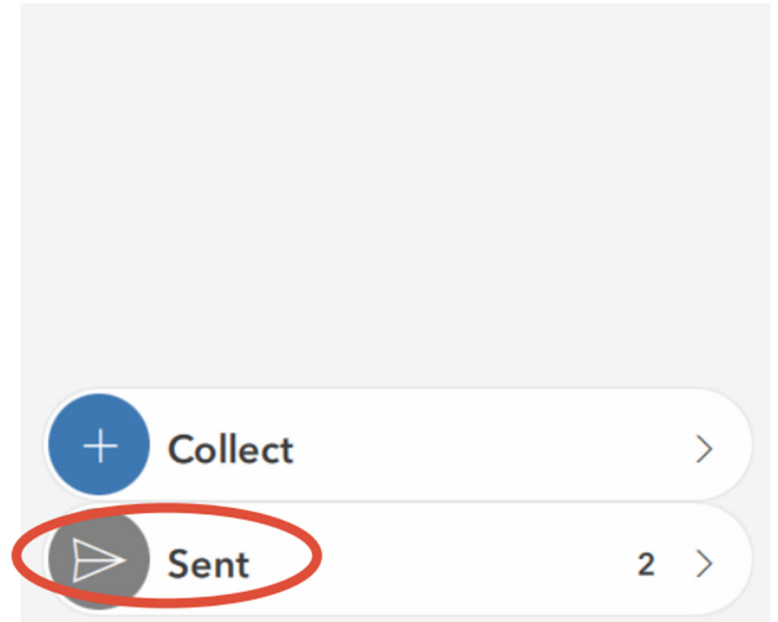

20. Once you have successfully submitted your fishing trip data it will appear on the main page under “Sent”.

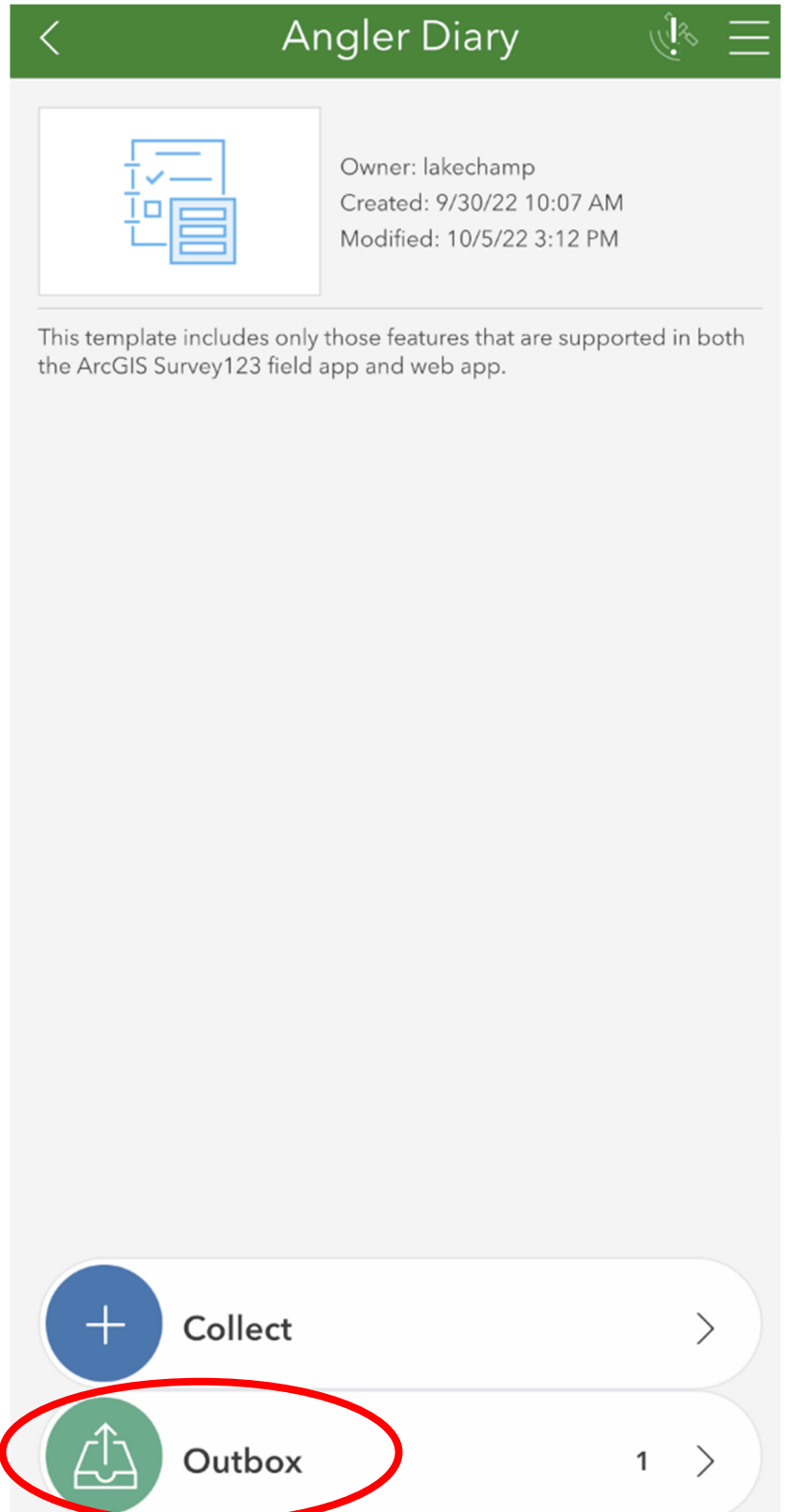

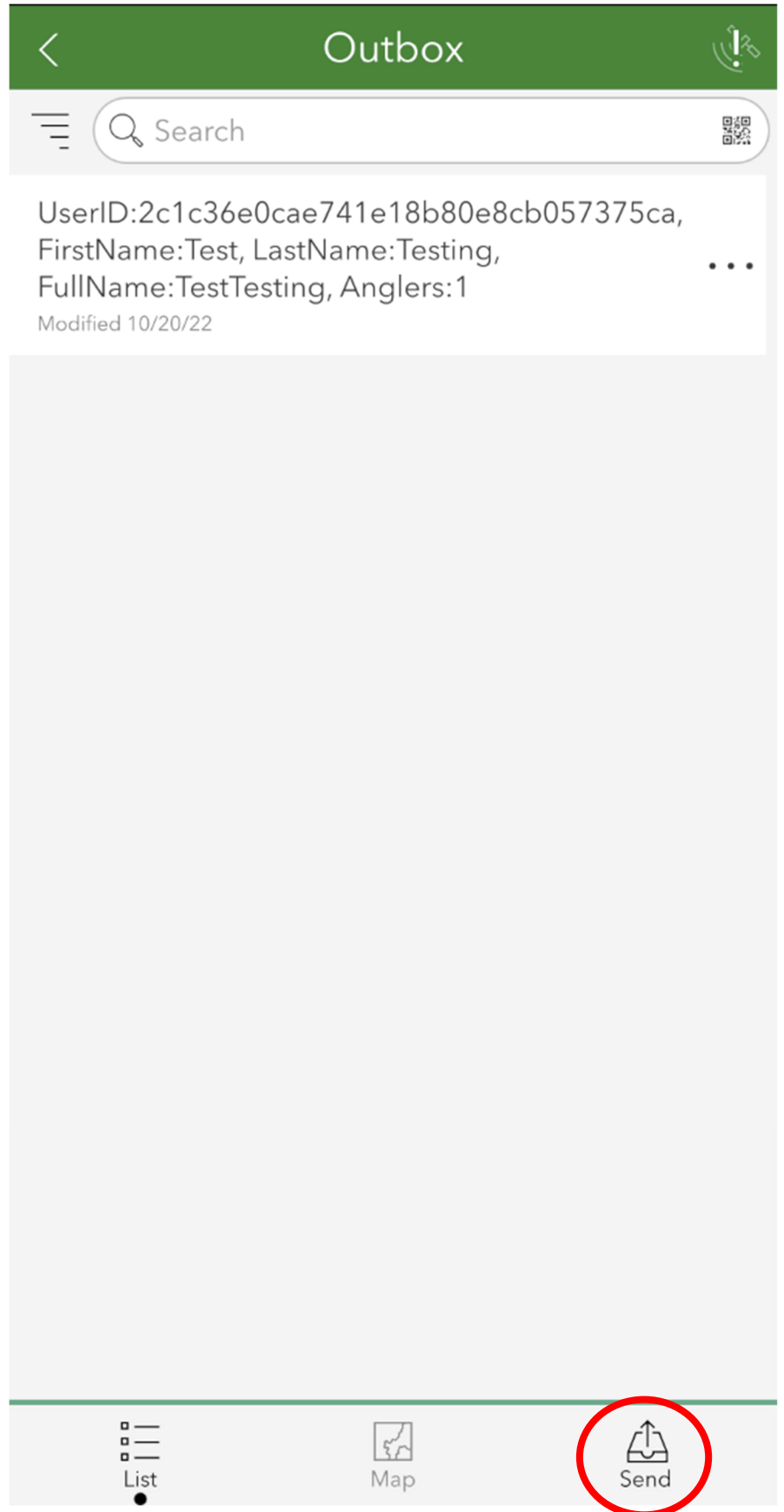
If you have entered the survey and attempted to send it but the survey does not send, you will notice the outbox now appears.

Frequently Asked Questions

Question 1

What are the data used for?

Answer: The data will be used to better determine catch and harvest rates from within the Lake Champlain basin to help inform management decisions.

Question 2

Do I need to talk to the creel clerk even though I will be reporting my trip using this app?

Answer: Yes! Although both programs are measuring effort, we would like to compare the two programs.

Question 3

What should I do if I fished multiple locations?

Answer: Create a separate entry for each location.

Question 4

When fishing with a large group that all start fishing at the same time but end as they reach their limit or decide to stop fishing early, what should I report?

Answer: The best practice would be to create a new entry for each group.

Example: A guide takes 3 groups of anglers fishing out on the ice at 8:00 a.m. The first group stops fishing at 12:30 p.m., the second stops at 2:00 p.m. and the third stops at 3:00 p.m. Each group should have a separate entry with the first group fishing for 4.5 hours, the second group fishing for 6 hours, and the third group fishing for 7 hours.
