

Magnificent Moles!

Moles live almost their whole lives underground!

They have tiny eyes and cannot see very well but have an amazing sense of touch – especially on their noses – their noses are six times more sensitive than human hands!

They have soft, velvety fur that does not catch dirt as they move through the soil!

They have five fingers with claws and one thumb on their front paws that help them to dig through the soil – they can dig up to 160 feet of tunnels in one night!

Moles eat insects, worms, and slugs – they can eat up to 50 pounds of worms in a year!

Moles are beneficial to our ecosystems – by tunnelling, they loosen the soil which helps plants to grow and allows water to filter through. They also eat many insects and slugs that can be pests.

The Townsend Mole is the biggest mole in the Willamette Valley of Oregon and is about 8 – 9 inches long.
