Visitors have the potential to observe thousands of migratory birds as they rest and feed in the wide-open spaces of northeast South Dakota. You may encounter huge flocks of waterfowl, such as snow geese, mallards, and northern pintails. Spring conditions are typically ideal for spotting Bald Eagles and if you're lucky, you'll be able to spot a nest or two! Bring Those Binoculars!
