Kelly Toy, Jamestown Tribe just called to find out what our process would be. I let her know that we need to get an opinion from our solicitor on management jurisdiction on the Use Easement. If management is within our jurisdiction, than we would need to follow NEPA guidelines in our process for evaluating the opening of a use on the Refuge. This would include an Environmental Assessment, CD, and Appropriateness and include quite a bit of public outreach because any opening of aquaculture within the Refuge management boundary would most likely be controversial. She wants me to write an email explaining the process that she can share with the Tribe - which I will do tomorrow.

As we were getting off the phone she mentioned that every time she turns around that there seems to be an erosion of Tribal Treaty Rights and that they are constantly being blocked by others.

So, tomorrow....I will right a letter about process and make sure I have planning take a look at it so I don't miss a step or misstate anything. I will also write a letter requesting assistance from the solicitor if my last ditch attempts at finding a past opinion don't pan out.
