Hope our below responses (in [blue](#)) to your request (in white) are helpful.

JST request: USFWS DNWR has no objection to the gear surveillance and retrieval plan submitted and approved as part of the Sect 7 consultation; and that USFWS DNWR intends to conduct a compatibility assessment and determination for any off-lease activity related to the gear plan after the USACE 404 permit is signed. This compatibility determination would appropriately limit and permit (via special permit authorization) off-lease gear retrieval. This is the same plan that we coordinated and provided a copy to you with submittal to Ryan McReynolds for in August of last year (see below) – attached again here for your convenience.

*FWS Response: The gear plan you provided appears to provide a good basis for a compatible approach, ensuring disturbance caused by gear retrieval does not outweigh impacts from the accumulation of gear within the Refuge. We will complete a Compatibility Determination process for gear retrieval, including public comment, after a permit is issued.*

JST Request: USFWS DNWR has no objection to Jamestown Tribe conducting on-lease wildlife monitoring in tandem with already scheduled and permitted shellfish farm operations.

*FWS Response: It is not within our authority to permit or deny aquaculture use within the lease area. Therefore, it is not our place to decide if monitoring actions taken within the lease boundary (related to the proposed aquaculture farm) meet USACE permit conditions. We do remain concerned that activities within the lease will impact wildlife using adjacent refuge lands and waters. We do not believe that conducting on-lease only monitoring will provide the information necessary to understand wildlife and habitat impacts and inform adaptive management of farm activities to reduce impacts.*

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Hi Jennifer,

Thank you for continued engagement with the Jamestown Tribe as we proceed with permitting and associated conditions for renewing the Tribe's oyster farm activity on our DNR leased tidelands within Dungeness Bay. It was helpful to understand the USFWS Compatibility Determination process that would be initiated for any off-lease activities after the permit is signed. The USACE confirmed that process, however for their administrative record they would like to assure that:

1. USFWS DNWR has no objection to the gear surveillance and retrieval plan submitted and approved as part of the Sect 7 consultation; and that USFWS DNWR intends to conduct a compatibility assessment and determination for any off-lease activity related to the gear plan after the USACE 404 permit is signed. This compatibility determination would appropriately limit and permit (via special permit authorization) off-lease gear retrieval. This is the same plan that we coordinated and provided a copy to you with submittal to Ryan McReynolds for in August of last year (see below) – attached again here for your convenience.
2. USFWS DNWR has no objection to Jamestown Tribe conducting on-lease wildlife monitoring in tandem with already scheduled and permitted shellfish farm operations.

As far as the particulars of the wildlife/bird monitoring plan, we received the combined USFWS comments. Thank you for your effort to collate and combine the group's thoughts. We are reworking the monitoring plan with those comments in mind. Based on those comments, we propose that the bird monitoring is conducted on-lease exclusively with no associated off-lease monitoring to be included in the Tribe's monitoring plan. However, as previously expressed during our conversations, the Tribe welcomes any off-lease companion monitoring by USFWS.
