Hello!

I thought it might be helpful for Service folks to be on the same page regarding our Colorado wolf meeting on Monday with the states, tribes, and Wildlife Services. Given the large group and the time we have, I expect an outcome of this meeting will be further conversations with specific groups (e.g., with a tribe, state ag department, etc.). Overall, my intention is to get everyone on the same page regarding where we are with the 10j rule and associated recovery permit, where CPW is with their reintroduction planning, and for folks to share information with others that are about to be engaged in similar work. And of course, for folks to ask us questions and help make this confusing process a little more clear

Our agenda for the meeting is as follows:

- Welcome (Matt) 3 minutes
- Introductions (Liisa facilitates for core folks - FWS and CPW) 3 min
- Orientation to Teams (Liisa) 1 min
- Reintroduction plan update (CPW - Eric O'Dell) 10 min
- Wolf reinstatement rule (Liisa) 2 min
- 10j rulemaking status (Craig) 5 min
- 10j rule/designated agent overview (Kurt) 20 min
- 10A1a permit/authorized individuals overview (Robert) 20 min

- Equipment/personnel (Scott) 20 min
- Closing (Liisa) 3 min

If you've done the math, that's 87 minutes (out of 90). Since we have a large group, I'd like for only the core folks involved from Region 6 (anyone on the core team that's on the call) and CPW (Reid, Brian, Eric, and Dave) to introduce themselves. I will have everyone else introduce themselves via chat and also ask that folks introduce themselves (name, agency) when they ask a question or make a comment. Craig: keep the rulemaking status high level, i.e., with the Director of FWS or with the Department is sufficient...I don't think most participants will care about the details that we obviously care about

Brady: I'd appreciate if you could come prepared to talk about the update to the Mexican wolf biological opinion, as it might come up.
