Dan,

After our conversation today, I reworked the numbers for the actual cost for the entire 18 days rather than multiplying the daily figure I came up with for eight days. The last figure multiplied the cost of supplies into the total amount which isn't correct. I also figured the salary/benefits based on the higher paid employee since I didn't know who would be working for those eight days. The APHIS Overhead was also calculated into that mistake. I apologize for the mistake. The total I came up with is \$9,027.11 and is broken down as follows:

\$6,105.44	Salary/benefits,
\$658.50	Camp rate/per diem,
\$828.00	Supplies (I figured 10 boxes of bird bombs and whistlers and four boxes of cracker shells),
\$180.00	Vehicle
\$1,255.17	APHIS Overhead.

If you were to purchase the cracker shells, bird bombs and bird whistlers, it would save on the supplies as well. If you decide to do that the cost will be \$8,065.39 and the breakdown will be as follows:

\$6,105.44	Salary/benefits,
\$658.50	Camp rate/per diem
\$180.00	Vehicle
\$1,121.45	APHIS Overhead

I spoke with our budget person and she told me the fastest way to get an agreement through was for me to get her the Scope of Work and Financial Plan by Tuesday. She will send you an electronic copy of it for you to review. If there are no big changes, we can get it signed and sent up the chain and it should be done and entered into the system before the project starts. It would have to be signed by your people next week in order to get it done in time. The important information she will need are the contact person and a tax ID number. Let me know as soon as possible which of these options you would like to go with and I will get the SOW/FP done as soon as I can. I will be working out of town toward the end of next week, so early in the week or today would be best.

Eric:

Thanks for the budget estimate. We look forward to having APHIS involved in this interesting project.

I just spoke with Gerry about modifying the existing cooperative agreement with APHIS to include your assistance in the Farallon work.

He seems to think that it would be difficult and perhaps even impossible for the FWS to receive the funds at this time of year because of their end-of fiscal year financial shut-down. He wanted me to inquire if it would be possible for IC to contract USDA directly for the work?

You alluded to a new cooperative agreement taking more time than we have, but would it work faster as a **contract** with Island Conservation (a non-profit NGO), rather than a *cooperative agreement modification* with the USFWS?

The \$12,538 contract figure you calculated is accurate based on the rate you quoted us this week. Although the amount is above the \$2,500/week figure we were given for the grant budget, we can take some funds from other areas to cover the \$7500 additional requested if that amount is inflexible. If you could send us a breakdown of the various amounts for Salary, supplies, per diem and overhead, we (IC) could identify areas that we could provide assistance (e.g. food and transportation) to help reduce the costs to you a little.

Let myself and Gerry know what's the best way to secure Val and Derek's involvement and transfer the specified funds to APHIS.

Dan/Gerry,

I worked out a budget for Wildlife Services to work on the Farallon project. For eight days the cost for Derek and Val will be \$5,572.42. This includes Salary/benefits, supplies, camp rate/per diem

and APHIS Overhead. If you want to add additional days, we could divide that amount by 8 which would be \$696.56 for each day after that. The easiest and fastest way to get an agreement in place would be to amend our agreement with the Don Edwards NWR and add that amount to it. I have included Joy on this email and she can pipe in and let us know if that is OK with her to amend that agreement. We could also set up a new agreement, but that could take more time than we have to get it in place.

Let me know how you would like to proceed or if you would like to add additional days to the agreement.
