LEASE AGREEMENT MANAGEMENT PLAN

- 1. Cable gates must be closed and locked when Operator is not physically on the area.
- 2. An approved Pesticide Use Proposal is required before pesticide application and the permittee is required to follow the associated guidelines contained in the Pesticide Use Proposal. Use of any other chemical (herbicide or pesticide) without an approved Pesticide Use Proposal will constitute a Refuge violation, and revocation of any Special Use Permit. Pesticide use must be reported by December 1st annually.
- 3. Permittee may be required to post fields after pesticide application (check with DNR office or Ag. Manager).
- 4. Acres to be planted to corn will have a target yield of at least 120 bushels per acre, therefore, requiring appropriate inputs of seed population, cultivation, fertilizer and herbicides. These fields must be planted by May 20, of each crop year unless extreme extenuating circumstances occur. For each year, the cooperator agrees to leave a designated amount of crop acres unharvested as over-winter wildlife food plots.
- 5. Acres planted to beans shall have a target yield of at least 40 bushels per acre, therefore requiring appropriate inputs of seed population, cultivation, fertilizer, and herbicides. Bean fields must be planted as early as conditions allow.
- 6. The cooperator will leave unharvested crop for winter food plots until march 1 of the following year. The cooperator may harvest food plots after that date as weather conditions allow. Food plot areas will be designated by Clear Lake Unit staff.
- 7. The cooperator agrees to certify all crop acres under the term of this lease with the USDA Farm Service Agency before the deadline.

- 8. All fields in this lease shall be planted with end rows. The adjacent grassland areas shall not be used as turn around areas.
- 9. Fall tillage is prohibited.
- 10. If cooperator is unable to plant designated corn acres to corn in the allotted time frame they must consult with DNR staff prior to planting an alternative crop.
- 11. Field marker posts are to be respected, if they are damaged, the cooperator will replace/repair the post ASAP. Do not increase field size.
- 12. GMO crop use is not allowed. Only conventional crop seed may be used on fields intended for food plots.
- 13. Neonicotinoid treated seed will not be permitted to be used on any U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service lands including Waterfowl Production Areas.
- 14. Seed tags for all fields must be supplied to Iowa DNR Clear Lake Wildlife Staff.
