Windom WMD Grazing Invitation News Release – April 1, 2025

The Windom Wetland Management District in Windom, Minnesota, is accepting bids for seven new grazing opportunities in Jackson, Martin, Murray and Rock counties of southern Minnesota for the 2025 grazing season. The seven new sites range in size from 56.5 to 140.0 acres. Producers must follow all federal and state regulations.

Applicants must submit a completed bid sheet from the bid packet by 4:00 p.m. on April 23, 2025. A Special Use Permit will also be required for each successful bidder.

Bid packets are available on the district website Windom Wetland Management District | U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (fws.gov) or by contacting assistant manager Todd Hauge at (507) 831-2220 or todd hauge@fws.gov. Packets include maps and all details for each activity and unit.

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

Authority: The information requested is authorized by the National Wildlife Refuge System Administration Act (16 U.S.C. 668dd-ee) and the Refuge Recreation Act (16 U.S.C. 460k-460k-4).

Purpose: To collect the applicant's information to process permits allowing for commercial activities such as: guiding hunters, anglers or other outdoor users; commercial filming; agriculture; rental of cabins and trapping while on the National Wildlife Refuge System.

2025 WINDOM WMD GRAZING REGULATIONS

- 1. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service reserves the right to modify or terminate the grazing Special Use Permit (SUP) if refuge staffing levels are insufficient to administer the grazing program or if habitat conditions warrant."
- 2. Use of minerals (salt or protein) will be allowed. Permittee must provide product labeling to the Refuge Manager for approval prior to use. Minerals must be in a container that minimizes spillage and are easily moved and placed as required by the Refuge Manager.
- 3. Supplemental feeding will not be permitted, all supplements need prior Refuge Manager Approval.
- 4. All liability relating to livestock and livestock management to include all persons working for the permittee, whether related, hired or as a partner is strictly that of the permittee as listed on the SUP.
- 5. The permittee must have/acquire liability insurance that covers the livestock being grazed on Service Lands. A copy of the liability insurance must be provided to the Refuge Manager.
- 6. The permittee must be in compliance with the respective state and local livestock health regulations.
- 7. All equipment for grazing, including ATVs and UTVs, must be clean and free of invasive species plant material including seeds before entering any Refuge, Waterfowl Production Area (WPA), or Service easement. The Refuge Manager reserves the right to inspect and deny the use of any equipment/vehicle/horse etc. that appears to contain invasive species plant material or seeds.
- 8. The use of pesticides requires advance U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service approval. The permittee shall provide the Refuge Manager with product labeling and/or the Material Safety Data Sheet 30 days prior to use to provide adequate time to determine approval or disapproval of the product. Permittee is required to report pesticide use if approved by [September 1].
- 9. Any livestock management action including branding or dehorning on Service land must be approved in advance by the Refuge Manager.
- 10. Subletting is not allowed. As approved by the Refuge Manager, partnering with another rancher will be allowed should the number of livestock needed to achieve the desired outcome not be obtainable by a single rancher. If partnering is allowed, the initial permittee will be solely responsible for the total payment, management, liability, and all special conditions of the permit.
- 11. Fence maintenance is the responsibility of the permittee. All temporary fence needs to be removed at the end of the grazing plan. Any repairs to or permanent fence constructed on National Wildlife Refuge System lands will become property of the Service.
- 12. Water will be available using area wetlands on Waterfowl Production Area. Methods of supplemental watering must be approved by the Refuge Manager.
- 13. The permittee must notify the Refuge Manager of deceased livestock. Deceased livestock must be removed from Service lands within 48 hours of discovery unless other arrangements have been approved by the Refuge Manager.
- 14. Following the completion of the final year of the permitted grazing season, removal of all temporary fencing and other equipment provided by the permittee is required. Failure to remove materials within 1 month

- after the completion of the final grazing season will result in a monetary fine and potential loss of consideration for future grazing permits.
- 15. The Permittee must provide the Refuge Manager, within 5 working days, the date, type, and number of cattle at the start and end of grazing each year or anytime cattle are added or moved off a unit.
- 16. The permittee shall not prohibit the public from entering Service lands or harass/interfere the public in any way that would distract from their enjoyment of the Service lands whether their livestock are currently grazing in the unit or not.
- 17. Permittee must provide a tax identification number or SS# for billing purposes.







2025 & 2027 Grazing Unit








