#### Morro Bay Yacht Club, Morro Bay, California

The California Department of Parks and Recreation plans to partner with Morro Bay Yacht Club to replace their failing dock. They plan to construct 130 feet of side-tie dockage for eligible transient recreational vessels and provide lighting, water and electric utilities to the dock. **Federal Funds Requested**: \$439,568.00; **Non-Federal Match**: \$146,684.57; **Total**: \$586,252.50

# Rockland Landings Marina, Rockland, Maine

The Maine Department of Transportation plans to partner with Rockland Landings Marina to rearrange existing floating docks, reallocate and dedicate a portion of the reconfigured docks to eligible transient use, install two new floating side-tie transient docks, and install new utility service (100A shore power and potable water). The project will significantly increase transient berthing capacity, provide improved berthing for a wide variety of transient vessel types and sizes, and provide new and improved slip utilities to serve transient boaters. Upon project completion, Rockland Landings Marina will offer 1,152 linear feet of dedicated transient dockage in the heart of downtown Rockland.

Federal Funds Requested: \$555,294.00; Non-Federal Match: \$249,480.00; Total: \$804,774.00

# Bayview Harbor Marina, Barnegat Light, New Jersey

The New Jersey Department of Transportation plans to partner with Bayview Harbor Marina to expand the south basin breakwaters of the marina to add nine transient slips. A mooring field will add nine moorings for transient vessels. A dinghy dock will be constructed for use by boaters who moor their vessels in the mooring field. A portion of the south breakwater will be replaced, and reconstruction of the existing bath house and laundry facility will occur along with the construction of a new transient boater lounge.

Federal Funds Requested: \$1,294,377.75; Non-Fed Match: \$431,459.25; Total: \$1,725,837.00

### **Conneaut Port Authority, Conneaut, Ohio**

The Ohio Department of Natural Resources plans to partner with the Conneaut Port Authority to construct 20 BIG-dedicated slips with the capacity to handle eligible vessels 26-100 feet in length.

Federal Funds Requested: \$983,675.00; Non-Fed Match: \$1,023,825.00; Total: \$2,007,500.00

#### Meigs Street Pier, Sandusky, Ohio

The Ohio Department of Natural Resources plans to partner with Battery Park Marina to create approximately 1,000 linear feet of side-tie dockage for BIG-eligible vessels by renovating the existing Meigs Street Pier. It will include 10 power pedestals, one common sewage pump out facility, fire suppression, and potable water connections. This renovation will provide safe and accessible transient docking and services to a high-traffic waterway not currently serving those needs.

Federal Funds Requested: \$488,139.96; Non-Fed Match: \$508,064.04; Total: \$996,204.00

### Bristol Borough Dock, Bristol Borough, Pennsylvania

The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission plans to partner with the Borough of Bristol to construct 14 transient slips and associated structures that can be utilized for securing eligible vessels and for shore access.

Federal Funds Requested: \$1,500,000.00; Non-Fed Match: \$954,050.00; Total: \$2,454,050.00

#### Ann Street Pier, Newport, Rhode Island

The Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management plans to partner with the City of Newport to extend the Ann Street Pier to add 410 linear feet of transient side-tie dockage along with six new utility pedestals.

Federal Funds Requested: \$1,433,647.00; Non-Fed Match: \$501,131.00; Total: \$1,934,778.00

#### Herreshoff Marine Museum, Bristol, Rhode Island

The Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management plans to partner with the Herreshoff Marine Museum to add 437 linear feet of transient side-tie dockage.

Federal Funds Requested: \$712,676.25; Non-Fed Match: \$247,005.75; Total: \$959,682.00

## Willoughby Marina, Norfolk, Virginia

The Virginia Department of Health plans to partner with Willoughby Marina to construct floating docks specifically dedicated to transient boaters, with services including shore power and water. The project will add a total 2,292 liner feet of dockage for vessels 35-65 feet in length.

Federal Funds Requested \$1,500,000.00; Non-Fed Match: \$1,691,489.37; Total: \$3,191,489.37

# Bayfield City Dock, Bayfield, Wisconsin

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources plans to partner with the City of Bayfield to add 10 new slips for public transient docking with full utilities and ADA-compliant access to/from shore.

Federal Funds Requested \$587,250.00; Non-Fed Match: \$195,750.00; Total: \$783,000.00
