Key Cave National Wildlife Refuge Seeks Comments on Draft Environmental Assessment and Spatial

Habitat and Species Management Plan (SHSP)

Key Cave National Wildlife Refuge (NWR, refuge) is located southwest of Florence, Alabama. Key Cave NWR was established in 1997 under the authority of the Fish and Wildlife Act of 1956, the Endangered Species Act of 1973, and the National Wildlife Refuge Administration Act of 1966, to ensure that the biological integrity of Key Cave, Collier Cave, Collier Bone Cave, and their common aquifer remains intact. Key Cave is the only known location for the federally endangered Alabama cavefish (Speoplatyrhinus poulsoni) and lies on the northern shore of Pickwick Lake in a limestone karst area that contains numerous sinkholes and several underground cave systems. The area's sinkholes are an integral component of groundwater recharge to the caves.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is proposing management objectives and strategies for habitats on Key Cave NWR for priority resources of concern stepped down from the Wheeler NWR Complex Comprehensive Conservation Plan. The current proposal would further protect Key Cave, endemic cave species and recharge zone; convert 208 acres of cooperatively farmed land to native grassland habitat; and manage forested habitat on the refuge.
