A popular destination for outdoor recreation, Montezuma NWR turkey hunting in accordance with New York State laws and refuge specific regulations.



Hunt Information

Montezuma NWR is open for the New York State fall, spring, and youth turkey hunting seasons. **All hunters must possess a valid daily permit (FWS Form 3-2542 Harvest Report)**, which is available at the Hunter Check Station (1095 State Route 89, Seneca Falls, 13148). Keep your permit on your person while afield. You may enter the refuge to obtain a permit no earlier than 2 hours before legal sunrise.

Hunting Regulations

Hunting regulations are designed to provide safe recreational opportunities through wise use of renewable wildlife resources. Hunting is permitted in accordance with Federal regulations governing public use on National Wildlife Refuges as set forth in Title 50 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Hunting will be in accordance with applicable State of New York regulations subject to the conditions stated below.

Blinds: We permit the use of ground blinds. Stands and blinds must be removed at the end of each hunt day per New York State Wildlife Management Area regulations. Hunting from a stand or blind that has been left overnight is not permitted.

Harvest Reporting

In addition to meeting statewide harvest reporting requirements, hunters must complete a Harvest Report (FWS form 3-2542) and return it to the refuge by the end of the day.

Access

The refuge is open to the State's fall, spring, and youth turkey seasons. Turkey hunters may access the Refuge two hours before legal sunrise until two hours after legal shooting time. Turkey hunting is permitted on designated areas of the refuge. The Wildlife Drive, Seneca Trail, and Esker Brook/South Spring Pool Trail areas are not open for turkey hunting. Access for turkey hunting is by foot from designated areas.

Vehicles: Licensed motor vehicles are permitted only on public use roads as shown on the map. ATVs and UTVs are prohibited.
