Attorney for the Defense of an Endangered Animal

1. Content Area: Science

2. **Grade Band:** 5-7

- 3. **State Standard:** Life Science Students know and understand the characteristics and structure of living things, the processes of life, and how living things interact with each other and their environment.
- 4. **Learning Objective:** Students will produce an argument about how an animal is protected by the ESA and how that protection needs to continue.
- 5. **Description of Activity:** Students will defend an animal's inclusion on the Endangered Species Act to a jury of their peers (classmates). Students may call witnesses during their defense (team members).
- 6. Duration: 60-120 minutes
- 7. **Location:** Classroom (follow up to Refuge field trip)
- Activity Preparation: Read and discuss the Endangered Species Act. There are

- 9. Materials Needed: Access to computers or library
- 10. Step-by-Step Instructions:
 - A. Show a courtroom scene from a TV show like *Law and Order* and have students define what a defense attorney does.
 - B. Preview the following vocabulary terms prior to students beginning their work:
 - Endangered
 - Species
 - Threatened
 - Habitat
 - Conservation
 - C. Divide students into groups, or allow students to work individually. Each group will pick an animal that is endangered and research why the animal is threatened.
 - D. After the presentations, the class can discuss if the laws are actually working to protect animals and their habitats.
