






El Camino del Diablo Road Guide

The Devil's Highway

Mile	#	Location
0	1	Darby Well Road (2.4 miles south of Ajo Plaza)
2	2	At this junction take the left fork to remain on Darby Well Road (right fork returns to Ajo via the Ajo Scenic Loop)
10	3	At this junction take the left for to remain on Darby Well Road (right fork 8114E takes you to Cameron Charco)
13	4	Enter Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument.
17	5	Bates Well (National Park Service)
23	6	Continue westward to reach CPNWR and El Camino del Diablo.(Pozo Nuevo Road keeps in inside Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument, and heads south-bound to Puerto Blanco Dr.)
26	7	Arrive at Cabeza Prieta NWR and sign in at the kiosk
27	8	San Cristobal Wash (heavy brush)
30	9	Cholla Pass
40	10	Papago campsite 1/8 mile east of Papago Well
41	11	Papago Well
43	12	Customs and Border Protection - Camp Grip
44	13	O'Neil Grave is on the north side of the road. There is a metal cross and the grave is covered with rocks and coins.
49	14	Las Playas—Dry Lakebed (ruts are always present; this is a problem area when wet)
52	15	Pinacate Lava Flow
53	16	Nameer Grave is on the south side of the road.
60	17	Pinta Sands (Wash)
72	18	Tule Well Campground is the junction with Christmas Pass Road.

There are two entrances to CPNWR and El Camino del Diablo from I-8. Both travel through the Barry M Goldwater Range and require a permit. The permit is free and is obtained online. Please visit our website for more information. **You need a high-clearance, 4-wheel drive vehicle to traverse El Camino del Diablo.**



From I-8 at Wellton use exit #30 and travel north 1 mile on William Street. Turn left at the stop sign and proceed west on Los Angeles Avenue. Travel approximately 4 miles and then south on Avenue 25E to reach the Barry M Goldwater Range entrance. It is an additional 32 miles to the western entrance of CPNWR (#19 on map).

From I-8 at Tacna use exit #42 and head south. Turn left (east) on the dirt road that is past the eastbound on-ramp. Continue eastbound 6 miles to the 4-way intersection. Turn south. It is an additional 23.2 miles to Christmas Pass Road (#20 on map).

“All traces of [El Camino del Diablo] are sometimes erased by the high winds sweeping the unstable soil before them, but death has strewn a continuous line of bleached bones and withered carcasses of horses and cattle, as monuments to mark the way.”
