

Updated Auto Tour Route Driving Directions 2026

How to get to the start of the Auto Tour Route:

- 1) From the Visitor Center parking lot, take a left on West Forest Street.
- 2) After driving about nine miles on West Forest Street, on your left side will be signage at the start of O-Line Canal Road marking the new Auto Tour Route entrance gate.
- 3) Take a left onto O-Line Canal Road and start your journey on the Auto Tour Route.

How to get back to the Refuge at the end of the Auto Tour Route:

- 1) The D-Line Canal Road officially ends at a T-intersection with the I-15 Frontage Road. Take a left at the Frontage Road and drive 0.5 miles to the W 2950 S interstate underpass.
- 2) Take a right on W 2950 S and drive under the interstate underpass. Drive another 0.6 miles and take a left at Perry Street.
- 3) Drive about 2.5 miles down Perry Street until you approach the traffic light at W 1100 S.
- 4) Take a left at W 1100 S and drive just over a mile to the I-15 entrance ramp. Take a right onto the interstate.
- 5) Drive one mile to the next exit ramp, Exit 363, and exit off the interstate.
- 6) Take a left onto West Forest Street at the end of the exit ramp.
- 7) Drive 0.5 miles down West Forest Street, and take a left into the Refuge's Visitor Center parking lot.

Updated Auto Tour Route Rules and Regulations

- 1) The Auto Tour Route is open sunrise to sunset, seven days a week, unless otherwise posted.
- 2) The Auto Tour Route is one-way only. Signs indicate correct direction of travel.
- 3) The speed limit along the Auto Tour Route is 25 mph unless otherwise posted.
- 4) Legally licensed motor vehicles are allowed only on Refuge roads open to the public. Follow all posted signage along the route. Unlicensed off-highway vehicles may not be used anywhere on the Refuge.

The Updated Auto Tour Route will only be open for the spring and summer seasons of 2026 due to a maintenance-related project closure on the normal Auto Tour Route. The updated Auto Tour Route is also a 12 mile drive.

The normal Auto Tour Route Day-Use Area will remain open throughout the season. However, access to the normal driving route will be closed. This will go into effect on Saturday, April 4, 2026. The normal Auto Tour Route will reopen prior to the start of Utah waterfowl hunt season.
