Deer Hunting

Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge

General Information

Just 26 miles as the crow flies from New York City, Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge attracts an estimated 185,000 visitors a year to its 7,855 acres. The refuge hosts an archery and six-day firearms seasons each year, in accordance with New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife (NJDFW) and refuge-specific regulations. In addition to providing recreation, the hunts conserve habitat for species such as forest-nesting birds. All hunters must obtain a refuge hunting permit, in addition to a New Jersey state license, before scouting and hunting.

Hunting Regulations

The regulations below supplement the general regulations which govern hunting on National Wildlife Refuges as set forth in Title 50, Code of Federal Regulations.

The 2026 deer hunting dates are:

Fall Bow: September 12th – October 30th, 2026

Youth Archery Day: September 26th, 2026

Permit Bow: October 31st – December 24th and December 26th – December 31st, 2026

Youth Firearm Day: November 21st, 2026

Six Day Firearm: December 7th – 12th, 2026

Winter Bow: January 1st – February 20th, 2027

**THE REFUGE IS NOT OPEN FOR SUNDAY HUNTING
BAITING IS PROHIBITED**

Permits

While **hunting or scouting**, permittees **MUST** carry a valid New Jersey Hunting License, a **NJDFW Zone 13 permit** from the state, and a **valid Great Swamp NWR Combination Hunt Permit**. Permits are not transferable and are not valid until signed.

***Note:** Coyote/fox may be taken incidentally while deer hunting on the refuge.

Weaponry

Bows are allowed in accordance with the regulations set by the NJDFW on all areas of the refuge that are open to hunting, including the wilderness area. For the firearm season, only muzzleloading rifles may be used to take deer in the Wilderness Area (see map). Shotguns or muzzleloaders may be used in all other areas of the refuge that are open to hunting.

Bag Limit

Bag limits are in accordance with those listed for Zone 13 in the NJDFW Digest (2026 Issue)

Scouting

Scouting is permitted two weeks prior to season opening, except for the Fall Bow (scouting opens the day permits are available for purchase). Weapons are prohibited while scouting.

Hunter Orange

Hunters must wear in a conspicuous manner on **HEAD, CHEST, and BACK** a minimum of **200 square inches of SOLID FLOURESCENT ORANGE** clothing during deer firearms seasons.

Observer

All refuge permit holders will receive one Observer Permit to allow one non-hunting person to accompany the hunter. This is an opportunity for others to learn about hunting or to assist the hunter. The holder of this permit must be set up with the hunter at the same location, and is not allowed to possess or shoot a weapon.

Deer Drives

All deer drives are prohibited.

Trail markers

All marking tape, reflective pins, or other materials used to mark trails must be removed at the end of the hunt day. The use of paint is prohibited.

<i>Tree stands</i>	Only portable tree stands may be used. All stands, ladders, cameras, and blinds must have the hunter's RAID # displayed. All hunter property must be removed no later than March 13 th , 2027. Anything left on Refuge Property after March 13 th will be considered abandoned and is subject to disposal. No Exclusive Rights: Placing a stand does not give you exclusive rights to the surrounding land. Hunters may use only one stand or blind at a time on refuge property.
<i>Hours</i>	Hunters may enter the refuge two hours before shooting time and leave no later than two hours after shooting time. See the NJDFW Digest for legal hunting hours.
<i>Parking</i>	Hunters must park in designated refuge parking areas (see map) with the Refuge Parking Permit displayed on the vehicle's dash. Do not block gates, roads and buildings.
<i>No Hunting Zones</i>	No Hunting Zones are located in various areas within the refuge. Hunting is prohibited in these areas. Refer to refuge hunt map for details.
<i>Nature Trails</i>	Hikers may be using the hiking trails during the hunting season. Use extreme caution. Refer to refuge hunt map for trail locations.
<i>Report Your Harvest</i>	Harvested game must be reported in accordance with state regulations. Please indicate you are hunting on FEDERAL land.
<i>Law enforcement</i>	Individuals utilizing the refuge are subject to inspections of permits, licenses, hunting equipment, bag limits, boats, vehicles, and their contents by refuge or state law enforcement officers.

Refuge hunting areas may change each year. Hunters are required to read the hunt maps provided. Please respect adjacent landowners, **DO NOT TRESPASS!**

Prohibited Activities

- Littering
- Use of a spotlight or other artificial light may not be used to locate wildlife.
- Baiting or hunting over bait, salt or any consumable attractant.
- Drives are prohibited.
- Drive or screw a nail, spike or other metal object into a tree or hunt from any tree in which such an object has been driven.
- Trimming or cutting vegetation.
- Use or possession of alcoholic beverages.
- Use of ATVs and/or dirt bikes.
- Target practice
- Camping and campfires
- Overnight parking
- Searching for or removing any object of antiquity including arrowheads, pottery or other artifacts.
- Blocking gates or roadways with vehicles.

An Important Message

Our wildlife is a valuable resource. Laws and regulations are intended to protect them, while allowing for some consumptive use. Hunters are encouraged to report any violations they may encounter to a State or Federal employee. The future of hunting on the refuge requires responsible hunter behavior and compliance with regulations.

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
