Per CBP's request, please find the top 50 priority locations for small wildlife crossings in the excel spreadsheet attached.

In the first tab, our top 50 are labeled as Priority 1. Should more than 50 small wildlife passages be a possibility, we have identified those as Priority 2.

Column B correlates to the KMZ location identifier in the attached maps.

In the second tab, we provided locations for additional larger openings, if the opportunity arises.

As requested, we have also prioritized the 6 mountain ranges for large wildlife passages:

1) Patagonia

- 2) Atascosa/Pajarito
- 3) Peloncillo
- 4) Huachuca
- 5) Baboquivari
- 6) Perilla
