Cassandra would be the likely point person, and should review the GPS locations to make the best in-the-field decisions on exactly where (which bollard) to cut the holes for the nine identified SBNWR locations. Can that even be done yet? Are all the bollard panels in place at the pertinent locations adjacent to SBNWR? If so, I think the best way to identify the exact locations is to mark the bollard with paint and adequately photograph the location in such a manner that any ultimate change can be documented. Is this possible?
