Christian: A couple of clarifications: When we adjourned the workshop, we had agreed to measure percent build-out in terms of acres of ground disturbance. We assume that "build-out" in your position paper reflects that definition?

Subsequent to our workshop, the Service field and regional staff discussed build-out and identified percent of dwelling units completed as a viable alternative index of panther impacts. The field office staff also discussed this new measure with Bruce. We'd like to confirm if ECPO has concluded that acres of ground disturbance is preferable to number of dwelling units for figuring percent build-out?
