Hello! Thank you for contacting me about the Raintree Creek site. I saw an email going around about tracking down certain sites in South Carolina, and I apologize for not contacting you sooner. To update, The Nature Conservancy transferred our conservation easement at Raintree Creek, which has the *H. naniflora* population, May 2009 to Spartanburg Area Conservancy ('SPACE'). They now hold the easement and monitor the property. Andrew Waters is the executive director of the organization and the best current contact about this property. His contact information is:

TNC last monitored the easement in 2009. At that time the *H. naniflora* population was present but the area was being invaded by a suite of invasives (English Ivy, Honeysuckle, Privet). The population is located in a 3.98 acre greenspace in the Raintree Creek subdivision in the heart of Spartanburg, SC.
