

Good Afternoon:

Enclosed please find an application and supporting documentation for a permit to import the trophy of a Bukharan Markhor (*Capra falconeri heptneri*) hunted in October of 2021 in Tajikistan.

In evaluating this application, please consider the information here and the information regarding markhor conservation and sustainable use submitted in support of the permit application of Mr. Charles Bradley Waibel.

In Tajikistan a community-based conservation model has been adopted, has reduced poaching, and has helped the markhor populations rebound as well as local populations of endangered snow leopard, black bear, and other species. Repeat markhor surveys are used to establish sustainable quotas and document the increasing population. That a new survey is planned for this year further demonstrates the consistent markhor management program in the region. The preliminary results suggest the markhor populations in Morkhur, M-Sayod, Saidi-Tagnob, and Muhofiz conservancies have continually increased since 2014, and the markhor expanded their range. (Michel 2016 pers. comm.)

The information previously submitted by Conservation Force and referenced also shows that the underlying hunting and trophy import pose no net harm to the markhor's status in the wild. The markhor benefit significantly from this program because it incentivizes local people, in anticipation of benefitting from sport-hunting revenue, to preserve and protect habitat and have little tolerance toward poachers. The underlying hunting and related import will not cause long-term decline or place the viability of the markhor species at risk. The successful recovery of the markhor population because of this community conservation initiative – at least three times the baseline population estimate – is the opposite of a “long-term decline.”

In addition, the underlying hunting and import will not lead to significant habitat loss or restriction, increase the risk of extinction, or interfere with the markhor's continued recovery. The conservation hunting is a catalyst for significant habitat preservation, with over 250,000 ha now set aside as wildlife areas managed by community-based conservancies, including approximately 74,750 ha specifically for markhor. These conservancies invest substantially in anti-poaching and protection efforts.

Finally, revenues generated from these limited hunts display the benefits of regulated international trade to developing nations. In part because of the markhor hunting, Tajikistan joined CITES as the 182nd party (https://cites.org/eng/182nd_Party_Tajikistan). This is a positive step that will benefit the markhor and other species in the long-term.

In sum, the Fish and Wildlife Service recognizes: "Well-managed sport hunting programs that encourage sustainable use can contribute to the conservation of wildlife and improve wildlife populations ... [and] involvement of the local community in conservation of a species results in better conservation outcomes, which improve even more if those efforts generate sustainable benefits for the community...." 79 Fed. Reg. 60365. Tajikistan's community-based conservation program for markhor is a well-managed program and the foundation of the markhor's long-term recovery. The program has been shown to protect habitat, properly monitor the species, reduce poaching, benefit and incentivize stewardship by the local people, and encourage stronger international participation and better overall wildlife management by the country's Government. This is an overall net benefit to the survival of the markhor and shows the import and underlying hunting program are not for purposes detrimental to the survival of the species.

Please reference the documents provided as well as documents previously presented by Conservation Force, Safari/ concession operators, the government of Tajikistan, and past hunters. Thank you for your usual courtesy and attention to this application.
