Subject: 2021 399 Efforts

Matt, here's an outline of efforts last year and the latest from this season. Let me know if you need additional details worked out on any of these points:

- August 2021: 399 and offspring increasingly come into conflict in the area surrounding Jackson, WY on private and USFS lands.
- October 2021: Wyoming Game and Fish requests USFWS take over management of 399 and cubs.
- October 2021: USFWS sends staff resources to Jackson, WY to manage 399 and offspring. This includes FTE grizzly staff and temporary hires. Interagency response team is formed between USFWS, NPS, USFS, and Wyoming Game and Fish. These efforts included detailed operational planning and cooperation. USFWS also led on significant public outreach (including door-to-door knock and talks).
- November 2021: During the first weekend of November the interagency team worked diligently to successfully capture and collar two of the cubs to assist with tracking and monitoring efforts in an attempt to head off potential conflicts.
- December 2021: 399 and offspring return to den site within Grand Teton National Park during the first week of December.
- April 2022: 399 and offspring leave the den site in Grand Teton National Park, remaining in the park initially and expanding trips onto private and USFS lands. Interagency group stood up again for the season.
- May 2022: 399 and four offspring officially separate, 399 has been seen with another large male. 399 last seen within Grand Teton National Park and the offspring have dispersed to surrounding areas.
