Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Request Relating To Occurrences Or

Presence of Canada Lynx In the State of Idaho from 2005 to the Present.

Dear Mr. Frost:

This letter concludes our response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated October 22, 2014 for the following documents:

- 1. Records of lynx occurrences or presence of Canada lynx (*Lynx canadensis*) in the State of Idaho from 2005 to the present. By "occurrences" or "presence" I mean records of both regular or recurring occurrences, sightings, or presence of Canada lynx, and records of episodic or transient occurrences, sightings, or presence of Canada lynx.
- 2. Records of correspondence from the State of Idaho (including any of its agencies) to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service related to Canada lynx, including specifically any comments or emails, formal or informal, and meeting notes related to the listing of Canada lynx under the Endangered Species Act (ESA), and the designation of critical habitat under the ESA.
- 3. Records of correspondence from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to the State of Idaho (including any of its agencies), or from the State of Idaho to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, related to Canada lynx, including specifically any comments or email, formal or informal, and meeting notes related to effects on Canada lynx of wildlife trapping activities in the State of Idaho.

We have carefully searched our files and located 30 documents responsive to your request which are enclosed on a CD. Exemption 5 USC§552 5.7B (1) Deliberative – Process Privilege was applied to three documents. Fish and Wildlife staff reviewed the

candidate documents line by line to determine the appropriate exempt information, segregated that information where possible, and released the remainder of each document as indicated. This privilege is designed to protect the quality of the agency's decision making process to encourage candid and frank discussions among agency officials; to protect against premature disclosure of proposed policies before they are finally adopted; and to avoid public confusion that might be caused by disclosing reasons and rationales that were not ultimately the basis for an agency's actions.

Exemption 5 USC§552 5.7B(3) Attorney-Client Privilege was applied to one document. This exemption reflects confidential communications between an agency attorney and his/her client for which the client has sought professional advice. The potential harm to the Service from disclosure would be to deter the agency from seeking legal counsel in the future. Fish and Wildlife staff reviewed the candidate document line by line to determine the appropriate exempt information, segregated that information where possible, and released the remainder of the document as indicated.

The decision to withhold the above-referenced material was made after consultation with Diane Hoobler, Pacific Region, Officer of the Solicitor, Portland, Oregon in the course of processing a previous FOIA request made by Noah Greenwald, Endangered Species Program Director, Center for Biological Diversity, Portland, Oregon on January 27, 2012. The FOIA Appeals Officer must receive your FOIA appeal no later than 30 workdays from the date of this final letter responding to your FOIA request. Appeals arriving or delivered after 5 p.m. E.T., Monday through Friday, will be deemed received on the next workday. You must include with your appeal copies of all correspondence between you and the bureau concerning your FOIA request, including a copy of your original FOIA request and this final response letter.

Failure to include this documentation with your appeal will result in the Department's rejection of your appeal. The appeal should be marked, both on the envelope and the face of the letter, with the legend, "FREEDOM OF INFORMATION APPEAL." Your letter should include in as much detail as possible any reason(s) why you believe the bureau's response is in error.

As part of the 2007 FOIA amendments, the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) was created to offer mediation services to resolve disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies as a non-exclusive alternative to litigation. For your information, Congress excluded three discrete categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(c) (2006 & Supp. IV (2010). This response is limited to those records that are subject to the requirements of FOIA. This is a standard notification that is given to all requesters and should not be taken as an indication that excluded records do, or do not, exist.

While processing your request, we located three documents that originated with the U. S. Forest Service. In accordance with the Department of the Interior's FOIA regulations (43 CFR §2.13(b)(2)), we are referring those three documents to the U. S.
