Hi Chris,

I am attaching, at the suggestion of Frank, a PDF that I constructed to display the numerous bear administrative boundaries relevant to management. Frank wanted something that has all of the spatial information in a single file that can be viewed without the use of a GIS software. When you first open it, it's a clutter of lines, but the convenience lies in the ability to toggle each layer on/off, as needed.

In the left column you will see a "layers" icon directly underneath the paperclip "attachment" icon. Click on this to expand a list of all the layers. Click on boxes to turn layers on/off as needed. Labels of BMUS and subunits were included, and can also be toggled off.

You probably know these boundaries so well that you don't need a reference – but it may come in handy as a quick reference when you wish to show someone else a particular boundary. In any case, thought I'd share it with you. (I can always add boundaries if you'd like - e.g. ranger districts, counties etc)

p.s. – you can zoom in to the PCA but things start to get fuzzy

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
