The attached maps show that the southern end of the Winds, where there are currently grizzly bears, does not have food storage orders on USFS lands. Can you tell me if this is correct and if so, what can be done to address this? We make much of the importance of food storage for human and bear safety in the Yellowstone ecosystem and push food storage on private lands and in communities in bear habitat. If this is correct that USFS lands with grizzly bears present do not have food storage in place, how will we remain credible?

Can there be a USFS push to correct this?
