Ms. Sullivan,

Thanks again for reaching out. I hope your discussion with Mr. Willey was informative. All public comments are reviewed and considered during the rulemaking process. The statement that "99.2 % of the public comments...were therefore not involved in the final decision" is inaccurate. Every comment is considered. All 290,000+ public comments.

Ultimately, the Endangered Species Act, as passed by Congress, requires that any final decision be "solely on the basis of the best scientific and commercial data available". The integrity of the ESA depends on decisions being based on science. Materials provided by the public are considered in this context and help ensure any final agency action on this issue are based on scientifically sound data, assumptions, and analysis.

I hope that provides some clarity. Thanks again for your interest in this topic.
