Hi all,

Thank you again for your willingness to help us summarize the issues we received in the first round of public comments.

Attached to this email is a document that contains a bulleted summary of all the content we received in the public comments. I organized those bullets into 76 different issues. I assigned each of these 76 issues to one of the people on this team. You will need to turn the bullets in your assigned issue into a succinct and coherent summary of all the comments we received on that issue (in paragraph form). We are not responding to these comments yet; we are merely creating an exhaustive, but concise, summary of the content of the public comments. Two things to note:

1. If there was an issue summary in the [2012 WY wolf delisting rule](#) that was similar to your assigned issue, I noted the number of the comparable issue. Feel free to refer to the cited issue summaries in the WY wolf rule for guidance on how to structure your summary. It is probably easiest to do a global find in the WY wolf rule for the issue number that I cite in the attached document (e.g. if I note Issue 27 as a good example, do a search in the WY wolf rule for the words "Issue 27").
2. The attached document is color-coded. Green text represents issues that came up in the public comments, blue text represents issues that came up in the peer review, and purple text represents issues that came up in both public comments and peer review. This key is also on the first page of the attached document. Please accurately attribute text to either public commenters, peer reviewers, or both. If the content came from a public commenter, you do not need to cite the source organization, just the fact that the issue was raised in public comments (as opposed to the peer reviews).

I tried my best to make the content as clear as possible. However, there will definitely be areas that do not make sense to you out of context. If you are unsure what a bullet means, please let me know so Jennifer and I can help you interpret or so that we can provide additional context.

The attached document has a name in black next to each issue. These are your assignments! Please write up the paragraph summaries to your assigned issues in the google document I just shared with you. This will allow us all to collaborate on the issue write-ups. The google document also contains an example write-up I did for whitebark pine. This example is likely longer than most of the summaries we will write.

We would like the issue summaries to be completed by COB Friday August 19. If you do not think you will be able to finish all of your assigned summaries by that date, please let me know ASAP so I can redistribute as needed. The break-down is as follows:

- Nathan: 19 issue summaries
- Joy: 18 issue summaries

Alex: 19 issue summaries

- Maricela: 11 issue summaries (plus the DPS/SPR comments)
- Jennifer: 8 issue summaries (highly technical issues)
