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U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service FY 2013 Cooperative Endangered Species Conservation Fund Project Descriptions Arranged by State

Habitat Conservation Plan Land Acquisition Grants by State:

California

Coachella Valley Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan (Riverside County) \$3,000,000.

This grant will result in the acquisition of up to 3,114 acres that will greatly enhance the existing Coachella Valley MSHCP by securing key regional wildlife linkages, sand transport areas, and preserving core habitat areas. The land acquisition will benefit 20 species, including federally listed species such as the Coachella Valley fringe-toed lizard, desert tortoise, and peninsular bighorn sheep. The acquisition will complement and greatly enhance the ecological value of the many other acquisitions that have previously occurred in these areas in the last few years.

San Diego County Water Authority Subregional NCCP/HCP (San Diego County) \$3,000,000.

These funds will purchase up to 300 acres that provide important habitat for the federally listed species covered by the HCP, including southwestern willow flycatcher, least Bell's vireo, and coastal California gnatcatcher. The SDCWA NCCP/HCP is the most recently approved regional plan in southern California. The HCP area encompasses approximately 922,000 acres of land within western San Diego County and southwestern Riverside County. The acquisition of these lands will complement the areas already protected by the HCP and are critically important to many listed species.

Western Riverside County Multispecies Habitat Conservation Plan* (Riverside County) \$2,773,398. This grant will support the acquisition of approximately 483 acres of land in Riverside County. This acquisition will benefit numerous sensitive species including federally listed species like the California gnatcatcher, Arroyo southwestern toad, and Quino checkerspot butterfly. The acquisition will support the assembly of the 500,000-acre preserve that is part of the Western Riverside MSHCP by protecting large blocks of coastal sage scrub, chaparral, and grassland habitats.

Utah

Washington County HCP Desert Tortoise Acquisition* (Washington County) \$1,419,266.

This grant will support the acquisition of up to 1,245 acres of habitat for the desert tortoise in the Red Cliffs Desert Reserve in southwestern Utah. Acquisition of these lands is essential in preserving the integrity of the reserve as these unburned parcels provide critical refugia for desert tortoises and seed sources for restoration of other areas of the reserve impacted by wildfires due to cheat grass invasions. Protecting this habitat will greatly complement the Washington County HCP and the work of many partners in establishing and managing the reserve for endangered species conservation.

Washington

I-90 Wildlife Corridor Phase V (King and Kittitas Counties) \$2,000,000.

This project will protect an additional 1,000 acres of habitat for the federally listed bull trout, northern spotted owl, gray wolf, and grizzly bear. In addition, it will protect habitat and improve habitat connectivity for 60 terrestrial vertebrates including wolverine, American marten, and Pacific giant salamander. This improved connectivity will increase the effectiveness of wildlife crossing infrastructure associated with the adjacent I-90 freeway. Acquisitions in this location are essential, as the opportunities to protect lands connecting the northern and southern Cascades are limited due to natural features and increasing human development. This latest acquisition, along with lands already protected by the Washington Department of Natural Resources, will contribute to the ecological integrity of the Central Cascades Ecosystem, including the lands covered by the Cedar River Watershed HCP.

Mountain View 4-O Ranch 2013 (Asotin County) \$2,000,000.

This project will protect 2,400 acres in extreme southeastern Washington, including one mile of the Lower Grande Ronde River and three miles of tributaries that support federally listed bull trout, as well as steelhead, interior redband trout, Pacific lamprey, and many other sensitive aquatic species. This project is part of a larger, multi-phased, landscape-level project that will eventually protect 13,000 acres and 15 miles of streams. The project is bordered on the north by Forest Service lands and on the south and east by Bureau of Land Management lands. This is a rare opportunity to purchase a large, ecologically-intact, and diverse landscape that protects many habitat types including uplands, cliff and talus habitats, meadows, springs, curl-leaf mahogany shrubland, interior grassland, and Ponderosa pine woodlands that support the federally listed gray wolf, as well as elk, bighorn sheep, deer, and golden eagles.

Habitat Conservation Planning Assistance Grants by State:

California

Bay Delta Conservation Plan (Sacramento-San Joaquin Bay-Delta) \$410,818.

This grant will support the development of an HCP/NCCP for the Sacramento-San Joaquin Bay-Delta (Delta) Region. The Delta is the largest estuary on the West Coast. The Delta supports over 750 plant and animal species, 126 of which are sensitive or listed as threatened or endangered. The Delta is also critical to California's economy, serving as the "hub" of the State's water infrastructure, supplying drinking water for two-thirds of Californians and irrigation water for over 7 million acres of highly-productive agricultural lands. The Bay Delta HCP/NCCP is being developed as a long-term comprehensive plan that will conserve and manage covered species and natural communities in perpetuity while providing reliable water supplies for the State's myriad of beneficial uses.

Placer County Conservation Plan (Placer County) \$911,500.

This funding will support the planning phase of the Placer County Conservation Plan in northern California. The county has partnered with other local, state, and federal agencies to develop the plan. Participating local agencies include unincorporated Placer County, the City of Lincoln, and the Placer County Water Agency. The primary objective of the plan is to balance development with the conservation of the county's natural resources and provide for the protection of sensitive species and their respective habitats. Numerous listed and sensitive species will benefit from this plan including vernal pool fairy shrimp, giant garter snake, and American peregrine falcon.

Yolo County Habitat Conservation Plan (Yolo County) \$999,000.

This funding will support the planning phase of the Yolo Natural Heritage Program (Yolo County HCP/NCCP) in northern California. The Yolo County Habitat Conservation Plan, comprised of Yolo County and all four incorporated cities (Davis, Woodland, Winters, and West Sacramento) is collaboratively developing a plan to protect habitat and agricultural land countywide while allowing for effective coordination between development agencies and conservation agencies to ensure conservation occurs through an effective, collaborative, and cost-effective process. The plan will also direct growth within cities while preserving open space to ensure important species habitat remains undeveloped. Numerous listed and sensitive species will benefit from this plan including vernal pool tadpole shrimp, giant garter snake, California tiger salamander, and least Bell's vireo.

Owens and Mono Basins Riparian Habitat Conservation Plan (Mono and Inyo Counties) \$182,250.

This funding will support the planning phase of the Owens and Mono Basins Riparian Habitat Conservation Plan in eastern California. The draft HCP covers 310,000 acres owned by the City of Los Angeles and managed by the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power in Inyo and Mono Counties, including all of the major waterways in the region. Other proposed plan activities include power production, livestock grazing, prescribed burning, fire suppression, weed control, agriculture, road maintenance, and habitat management. The HCP targets seven species including four federally endangered species: Least Bell's vireo, southwestern willow flycatcher, Owens pupfish, and Owens tui chub.

Florida

Statewide Habitat Conservation Plan for Florida Beaches (35 Coastal Counties-Statewide) \$735.098.

This grant will assist stakeholders develop a plan to assimilate acquired data into a detailed draft of the HCP. Activities in the coastal area and their threats to listed species will be also be analyzed. The goal of the HCP is to allow for ongoing beach structure protection measures while limiting and mitigating the adverse effects to nesting loggerhead, Kemp's ridley, leatherback, green, and hawksbill sea turtles, five beach mouse subspecies, and shorebirds, including wintering piping plover. The Florida Department of Environmental Protection is leading this effort in conjunction with builders groups, municipalities, and others.

Polk County Multi-Species Habitat Conservation Plan (Polk County) \$277,029.

This grant will assist in initiating planning for a county-wide HCP for scrub habitats benefitting the Florida scrub-jay, eastern indigo snake, sand skink, blue-tailed mole skink, and other dry scrub species. Implementation of an HCP in Polk County marks a significant step forward for scrub conservation in the heart of Florida's central ridge that can be linked to similar efforts in neighboring counties.

East Collier County Multiple-Species Habitat Conservation Plan (Collier County) \$615,408.

This grant will assist planning for the first area-wide HCP to cover the endangered Florida panther. Expected results include production of a draft HCP and environmental impact statement. Implementation of this HCP will provide the first such conservation plan in the panther's primary recovery zone. The plan represents a collaborative effort among many private stakeholders with ranching, development, and conservation interests.

Georgia

Lower Flint River Basin Habitat Conservation Plan (15 Southwest Georgia Counties) \$263,458.

This grant will assist in the second year of planning for a basin-wide HCP for aquatic habitats used by federally-listed mussels such as the shinyrayed pocketbook, oval pigtoe, Gulf moccasinshell, purple bankclimber, and fat threeridge. Other aquatic species to benefit include fifteen fish, mussel, reptile, and amphibian species of state management concern. Increasing demands for water resources in this vital agricultural area combined with recent droughts have made clear the need for proactive conservation planning in this region.

Hawaii

Coordination and Planning of the Kaua'i Seabird Habitat Conservation Program on Kaua'i, Hawai'i (Kaua'i County) \$445,331.

This project will continue the development of an HCP for 14 applicants, including the County of Kaua'i, Kaua'i Island Utility Cooperative, and the Hawai'i Department of Transportation, to address incidental take of listed species from light attraction and utility line collisions. Three federally listed species -- the Hawaiian petrel, Newell's shearwater and green sea turtle -- one candidate species, the band-rumped storm petrel, and a host of endangered plants will be covered under the HCP. The green sea turtle was recently added to the covered species based on new information indicating that coastal lights have resulted in the take of nesting turtles. Ninety percent of the world's Newell's shearwater population breeds on Kaua'i and the population has declined by 75% since the early 1990s. When completed, the HCP will provide a legal solution to the incidental take of listed seabirds, enable multiple entities to obtain federal and state authorization of this take, and initiate mitigation to offset take through management that will benefit nesting seabirds and sea turtles.

Kaua'i Nēnē Island-wide Habitat Conservation Plan (Kaua'i County) \$508,348.

This project will develop an island-wide HCP for incidental take of the federally endangered Nēnē, or Hawaiian goose, associated with agriculture, public/air safety, and residential homes. The HCP will implement effective take avoidance and minimization strategies and ensure that these strategies are in accordance with the species' long-term recovery goals. The island of Kaua'i supports the only self-sustaining population of Nēnē and individuals are increasingly found foraging and nesting in agricultural areas, residential areas, and golf courses where fresh

water and food plants are abundant. These areas expose Nēnē to threats from agricultural operations, construction, vehicles, and predation from domestic animals. Occasionally, the presence of Nēnē at airports constitutes a risk to the safe operation of aircraft. The mitigation developed in the HCP will provide a net recovery gain for the species, and core areas where birds can safely forage and breed will be identified and managed. Public outreach and education funded as part of this grant will help offset growing tension among farmers whose crops are being damaged by Nēnē.

Multi-State

Multi-Species Habitat Conservation Plan for Wind Energy Development in the Midwest (Indiana, Michigan, Missouri- Statewide) \$950,000.

This grant will allow the natural resource agencies within the Service's Midwest Region to continue the development of a landscape-level, multi-species HCP throughout eight states to provide conservation benefits to listed species, while accommodating wind development. The plan will provide a means for wind energy developers to avoid, minimize, mitigate, and compensate for adverse effects to covered species such as the endangered Indiana bat, gray bat, interior least tern, Kirtland's warbler, piping plover, and several unlisted bat species. As a part of the HCP, all eight states in the Midwest Region will work in collaboration with the wind industry and The Conservation Fund to lead a strategic conservation planning process that focuses on integrating species needs with potential habitat mitigation across the landscape.

Oregon

Deschutes Basin Multi-Species Habitat Conservation Plan (Crook, Deschutes, Jefferson, Klamath, Sherman, and Wasco Counties) \$410,000.

This project will continue the development of an HCP for the Deschutes Basin Board of Control, member irrigation districts, and the City of Prineville that will benefit aquatic-dependent species in the upper Deschutes Basin, while meeting current and future irrigation and municipal water needs in a balanced, economically viable, and sustainable manner. Eleven species will be covered under the HCP, including the federally listed bull trout as well as the middle Columbia River steelhead and the Oregon spotted frog, a candidate for federal protection. When completed, the HCP will provide ecosystem benefits to large areas of the upper Deschutes River basin, which includes the Metolius, Crooked, and Deschutes river basins.

Tennessee

Development of a Habitat Conservation Plan by City of Crossville and Cumberland County, Tennessee (Cumberland County) \$645,366.

This grant will assist in the ongoing development of the Cumberlands region-wide HCP to protect aquatic resources. Several mammals, mussels, reptiles, amphibians, fish, and aquatic invertebrates will benefit from this effort to develop protective measures in an ecologically-diverse region that is beginning to experience increased development and resource extraction issues. The HCP will provide management prescriptions and regulatory guidelines to minimize and mitigate development effects on the target species and habitats. With the plan in operation, regulatory processes for the covered municipalities will be streamlined. Listed species include the Indiana bat, gray bat, spotfin chub (a fish species), purple bean (a freshwater mussel), and Cumberland rosemary and Virginia spiraea (plant species).

Washington

South Puget Sound Prairie Habitat Conservation Plan (Thurston County) \$626,687.

This project will continue the development of an HCP for the best remaining prairie habitats and restoration sites in South Puget Sound. It will identify the set of tools necessary to supplement more traditional conservation strategies to achieve the long-term preservation of a network of habitats needed for the survival of up to 18 species such as the threatened golden paintbrush and water howellia, as well as the mardon skipper, Mazama pocket gopher, and other species of concern.

Recovery Land Acquisition Grants by State:

Arkansas

Building a Conservation Corridor for the Recovery of Federally-Listed Species, Saline River (Ashley County) \$1,342,687.

This grant will enable the acquisition of 1,611 acres of important riparian and upland habitat adjacent to the Saline River to directly benefit two federally-listed endangered freshwater mussels, the winged mapleleaf and pink mucket. This acquisition will also benefit the endangered red-cockaded woodpecker and serve to protect the rabbitsfoot, a mussel recently proposed for listing as threatened. This acquisition will help further achievement of the recovery criteria for these species by protecting known population locations and will increase protection of the most important section of the Saline River for mussels west of the Mississippi River.

California

Metcalf Meadow* (San Bernardino County) \$1,170,000.

This project will acquire and permanently conserve land within Metcalf Meadow, one of the few remaining intact meadows on the southern shore of Big Bear Lake. The parcels provide important habitat for the recovery of meadow and pebble plain plant species including the federally listed pedate checker-mallow, California taraxacum, San Bernardino bluegrass, and Bear Valley sandwort. The large, contiguous parcels are connected hydrologically with parts of Metcalf Meadow on nearby San Bernardino National Forest and are important to maintain given the sensitivity of meadow habitat to changes in hydrology that could occur if these lands were otherwise developed. The federally and state endangered southwestern willow flycatcher has also been documented along Metcalf Creek.

San Diego Mountain Ranch* (San Diego County) \$317,200.

This project will protect, through fee title acquisition, the San Diego Mountain Ranch which occupies a large part of the Miller Creek watershed and provides local connectivity between Miller Valley and Clover Flat. The areas along the creek offer high groundwater elevations and relatively wide floodplains, supporting wet grasslands. These stream habitats and the adjacent floodplain provide for breeding, rearing, foraging, and overwintering of the federally endangered arroyo toad. Acquisition will also benefit the federally endangered Quino checkerspot butterfly given that the southern three-quarters of the San Diego Mountain Ranch constitute the largest single block of designated critical habitat for the species in the La Posta/Campo core occurrence

complex. Protecting the La Posta/Campo complex is vital to maintaining Quino checkerspot butterfly metapopulation dynamics by enabling exchange of individuals among subpopulations.

Colorado

Segelke-Carey Ranch for the Preble's Meadow Jumping Mouse (Larimer County) \$400,000.

This grant will fund the acquisition of the Segelke-Carey property, a rare opportunity to protect more than one mile of excellent riparian habitat for the threatened Preble's meadow jumping mouse along the Colorado Front Range, where land values have kept protection out of reach. This acquisition will prevent development from encroaching on this important riparian and upland habitat and ensure connectivity with protected areas up and down stream.

Florida

Listed Species Recovery on the Lake Wales Ridge Conservation Easement for the Robinson Property (Highlands County) \$854,364.

This grant will enable the acquisition of a conservation easement on 565 acres on the Lake Wales Ridge to protect scrub habitat important for the federally threatened Florida scrub jay and sand skink as well as the gopher tortoise, a Federal candidate species. The conservation easement will help achieve recovery criteria for the Florida scrub jay and sand skink, expand an existing conservation area, and provide connectivity among existing managed lands.

Georgia

Acquisition of the Ironstob-Braswell Mountain Tract within the Raccoon Creek Basin, a Tributary to the Etowah River (Paulding County) \$1,000,000.

This grant will enable the acquisition of 1,000 acres along Raccoon Creek in the Etowah basin to benefit two federally-listed fish, the endangered Etowah darter and the threatened Cherokee darter. Raccoon Creek has been identified as essential habitat for the long-term survival of these fish and the acquisition of this tract will help meet recovery objectives for these species. Permanent protection of this tract will also provide important connectivity to other protected areas and benefit a number of other rare aquatic and terrestrial species in the watershed.

Hawai'i

Kalauao Acquisition and Endangered Species Recovery (Honolulu County) \$578,250.

This project will acquire 635 acres of forested lands on the island of O'ahu. This narrow tract lies between two existing conservation areas and extends to top of the Ko'olau Mountains at 2,750 feet in elevation and is part of USFWS-designated critical habitat for the endangered O'ahu 'Elepaio, an endemic Hawaiian songbird, and eleven plant species. The upper reaches of this parcel support some of the best examples of native forest remaining on O'ahu. The popular 'Aiea Ridge Trail falls entirely on the subject parcel, and thus offers hikers the opportunity to access high quality native forest and to observe native birds. This purchase will ensure continued public use, which in turn will result in a greater public appreciation for native forest. Project partners include the Hawai'i Department of Land and Natural Resources, the Ko'olau Mountains Watershed Partnership, and Kamehameha Schools.

Nebraska

Recovery Land Acquisition for the Salt Creek Tiger Beetle (Lancaster County) \$190,301.

Acquisition and restoration of the habitat on this parcel will allow for reintroduction of the endangered Salt Creek tiger beetle. Providing additional reintroduction locations is critical for avoiding extinction of this highly-imperiled species with only a few hundred individuals left. This effort will also protect and restore Eastern Saline Wetlands, which are the most limited and endangered wetland type and vegetation community in Nebraska.

New Jersey

Bog Turtle Recovery in Sussex County I (Sussex County) \$40,000.

This acquisition project will purchase 20 acres of bog turtle habitat connecting two high-quality bog turtle population sites, thus providing landscape-level protection for this vulnerable federally threatened species. This property is part of a unique spring-fed wetland complex with calcareous fens and is host to a globally rare plant, the spreading globeflower. The State of New Jersey Green Acres Program is working with the New Jersey Lands Trust to protect and manage this and adjacent properties in perpetuity.

Bog Turtle Recovery in Sussex County II (Sussex County) \$400,000.

This acquisition project will protect the bog turtle through a purchase of four tracts from a single landowner for a total of 143.6 acres. This property connects two known bog turtle habitat areas within a large wetland complex and stream corridor. The property also provides landscape-level protection with upland forest and grassland habitats, thus conserving the hydrology and water quality of the wetlands. It is a rare opportunity in New Jersey to find such a large, undeveloped property adjacent to a growing network of protected properties that can help meet the recovery goals for this imperiled species.

North Carolina

Conservation of Habitat for the Spotfin Chub, Littlewing Pearlymussel, and Appalachian Elktoe (Macon County) \$142,500.

This project will acquire 39 acres with approximately 2,600 feet of frontage on the Little Tennessee River in western North Carolina to benefit three federally-listed aquatic species: the threatened spotfin chub, the endangered littlewing pearlymussel, and the endangered Appalachian elktoe. Acquisition of this land will help achieve the highest priority recovery goals for these species by protecting important habitat and reducing the threat of increased sedimentation.

Oregon

Upper Sevenmile Creek Flow Restoration Easement (Klamath County) \$355,719.

This project, which was provided partial funding in 2012, will acquire a conservation easement on the JaCox Ranch that will permanently transfer water rights to instream flow in order to restore year-round hydrologic connectivity to Sevenmile Creek. The existing water rights allow for the diversion of the entire summer flow of Sevenmile Creek, dewatering two miles of important habitat and disconnecting upstream and downstream pristine habitat. The acquisition will restore hydrologic connectivity and fish passage in an important area for endangered bull

trout. This project will also increase lake levels and improve access to cold-water springs and wetland refugial habitats during the late summer period for the protection of endangered Lost River and shortnose sucker. This acquisition will provide benefits to multiple other species in the middle and lower reaches of the Klamath River basin including lamprey, Chinook and the federally listed coho salmon.

Pennsylvania

Acquisition of a Bog Turtle Site of Global Significance in Pennsylvania (Monroe County) \$262,500.

This acquisition project lies in eastern Pennsylvania's Cherry Valley, at the core of the range of the federally listed threatened bog turtle. The Fish and Boat Commission (PAFBC) will work with multiple partners to purchase approximately 95 acres that provide core, secondary, and buffer habitat for the largest known population of bog turtle in the northern range of this species, and possibly the largest wild population in the world. The protection of this property provides an extension of a growing network of protected habitat and important landscape features including The Nature Conservancy and National Wildlife Refuge lands secured for the long-term conservation of this globally-significant bog turtle population. The protection of this property will also directly benefit many state species of greatest conservation need, as well as improve watershed features for federal species of concern found within this valley, including the American eel, dwarf wedgemussel, northeastern bulrush, and the Indiana bat.

Texas

Solana Ranch Preserve (Bell County) \$881,250.

This funding will allow the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department to acquire a 256-acre tract located in Bell County to benefit the Salado salamander. The acquisition will provide protection for the species in three of the seven springs in which it is known to occur. Acquisition of the Solana Ranch Preserve will protect an area of 75 percent of the proposed critical habitat units for this species in the Service's Southwest Region. The acquisition will also protect the quality of cave and spring water, minimize ground water pollution, protect groundwater and spring flow, and exclude cattle and feral hogs.

Washington

Camas Meadows Natural Area Preserve (NAP) In-holdings (Chelan County) \$749,400.

This project will acquire 60 acres of private land in the Camas Meadows Natural Area Preserve (NAP), which supports an estimated 95% of the worldwide population of the federally endangered Wenatchee Mountains checker-mallow, a locally endemic species only known from five sites within a five-by-ten mile range. The land acquired will be protected in perpetuity for the benefit of this and other federally and state-listed species, including the northern spotted owl, Wenatchee larkspur, tall agoseris, and white-headed woodpecker. This acquisition will contribute to the recovery of the Wenatchee Mountains checker-mallow by protecting individual plants as well as habitat on private lands. Adding these lands to the NAP will enhance the viability of the population throughout the entire site by protecting additional contiguous, occupied habitat and the last unprotected reach of a stream important to the site's hydrology. Purchasing these in-holdings improves the conservation value of the entire NAP by eliminating potential land-use conflicts.

Wisconsin

Kirtland's Warbler Recovery Land Acquisition (Adams County) \$759,000.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is awarded \$759,000 to acquire up to 1,500 acres of land to benefit the endangered Kirtland's warbler, Karner blue butterfly, and associated barrens species. Land will be acquired in fee title or conservation easement and will be managed in perpetuity to provide nesting habitat for this endangered migratory song bird and other species. Completion of this acquisition contributes to a larger project to protect 9,150 contiguous acres of habitat in central Wisconsin.

PROJECT STATEMENT

<u>Need</u>: The last remaining population of Florida panther (*Puma concolor coryii*) exists in southwest Florida, with the core population occurring in Collier and Hendry Counties. Historical losses of native panther habitat to agriculture and development land conversions, along with habitat fragmentation, have reduced the acreage and functional connectivity of native habitats that provide primary ecological support for the panther.

On a local and state level, a unique land use program, known as the Rural Land Stewardship Area Overlay Program (RLSA), has been established for a 196,000+/-acre area in eastern Collier County, where a significant number of panther home ranges exist. This program creates strong incentives for the perpetual conservation of higher quality habitats, in exchange for development rights on more ecologically impacted lands (*i.e.*, previously converted and/or disturbed lands). The habitat evaluations are performed in a landscape-scale context, explicitly recognizing major wildlife corridors, with a high degree of emphasis on habitat protection for panther and other listed species.

The RLSA has successfully demonstrated an ability to provide high-quality habitat protection for panther and other listed species; however, no federal process currently exists or is in place for a comprehensive federal review of projects subject to the RLSA program. The development and implementation of a multi-species HCP though the federal Endangered Species Act will provide the federal parallel to the state/local RLS program, and will achieve the primary goals of the Cooperative Agreement between the State of Florida and the Department of the Interior under Section 6 of the Endangered Species Act.




Figure 1. Eastern Collier MSHCP location map. The MSHCP area is bounded on the south by two federal preserves (Florida Panther National Wildlife Refuge and Big Cypress National Preserve), with Everglades National Park to the south and east. The MSHCP area and the Okaloacoochee State Forest provide important linkages for panthers dispersing northward into central Florida.

<u>Objective</u>: The objective of the Eastern Collier Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan (herein MSHCP) is to provide a long-range (50 year) conservation and land-use planning framework for approximately 177,000± acres in southwest Florida (Figure 1). The MSHCP establishes a regional Habitat Conservation Plan to cover twelve (12) federally listed, candidate, and non-listed species (Table 1), which will include an associated Implementing Agreement and an Incidental Take Permit (ITP). The MSHCP process is subject to the development of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

Expected Results: Establishment of the MSHCP will allow the implementation of long-term conservation measures for Florida panther and other federally listed species on a coordinated landscape-level scale, rather than on a case-by-case permitting basis. The MSHCP provides increased certainty for conservation planning, and will ultimately result in a balance of natural areas, agricultural landscapes, and sustainable development within the MSHCP area. The FY2013 grant will advance the MSHCP into the final review and approval stages.

Approach: A group of eight (8) large property owners, collectively identified as the Eastern Collier Property Owners (ECPO), has initiated major steps to work towards establishment of the MSHCP. ECPO has already invested a significant amount of time, resources, and money to advance the MSHCP process, prior to receiving any federal matching funds. These efforts have been and are endorsed by many environmental NGOs and other stakeholders (see letters of endorsement in Attachment 1).

The Eastern Collier MSHCP was previously awarded a Habitat Conservation Planning Assistance Grant in FY2012, for \$149,949 (out of a requested amount of \$270,000). Under the FY2012 grant, the deliverables due by September 30, 2013 include:

- A complete initial draft of the MSHCP document
- Details of HCP plan elements/thresholds and funding mechanisms
- Publication of the Notice of Intent (NOI) for an EIS in the Federal Register

As evidence of progress made to date, ECPO and its consultants have held a series of internal meetings related to the design and implementation of the MSHCP. ECPO's technical consultants have compiled and reviewed a large volume of scientific literature related to the MSHCP, and will begin the draft MSHCP document this month. ECPO worked with FWS to produce a third-party EIS bid package in early 2012, which was sent to qualified consulting firms within Florida. A third-party EIS consultant was selected by FWS in October 2012, and is poised to begin preparations for public scoping and publication of the NOI under the FY2012 grant.

This grant application seeks to build upon these existing activities by initiating and completing the following discrete activities in FY2013 (October 1, 2013 – September 30, 2014). Time estimates were arrived at in consultation with FWS and through use of an EIS timeline spreadsheet. Due to the number of activities and multiple parties involved with development of the MSHCP, EIS, and Implementing Agreement documents, some activities overlap in time. The schedule assumes the effective date of the grant award document is November 2013.

For this FY2013 grant application, the deliverables will be the MSHCP, DEIS and Implementing Agreement documents, which will have undergone at least two full reviews by FWS, and will be ready for review by the FWS Regional Office and Solicitor.

Location: The location of the area for the proposed HCP is 177,000+/-acre area located in the eastern portion of Collier County, Florida as depicted on Figure 1.

Estimated Costs: ECPO's efforts and total costs for consultants necessary to complete the activities identified for FY2013 under *Approach*, above, are estimated at \$1,207,908, not including expenditures to date. The proposed percentage of cost share provided by non-Federal partners (primarily allowable costs incurred by ECPO) is 50 percent, which would correspond to a grant award of \$615,408 if fully funded. Full funding of the Eastern Collier MSHCP, the second largest private-sector HCP in the southeastern United States, will allow the project to maintain the projected schedule and secure significant conservation measures for the Florida panther and nine other covered species.

The estimated costs for producing the DEIS (\$635,000) are in accordance with past DEIS costs for projects of similar size and complexity. The number is also consistent with the mean estimates from multiple bids received by FWS for the Eastern Collier MSHCP third-party EIS contractor. The multi-party DEIS working meetings and calls anticipate a minimum of 240 hours of conference calls between the third-party EIS consultant, FWS, the applicant, NGOs, and/or the applicant's consultants, along with a minimum of four (4) all-day meetings in Vero Beach or Naples, Florida.

Two revisions to the draft MSHCP document are in accordance with HCP costs for other projects, especially considering the large size of this MSHCP (177,000± acres), the number of covered species (12), and the number of ITP co-permittees (initially 8, with the capacity to add others). The budget assumes a minimum of eight (4) all-day internal meetings between the co-permittees and their consultant(s), and a minimum of four (4) half-day meetings with FWS in Vero Beach, Florida.

Development and finalization of the Implementing Agreement (IA) comprises the most complex and intensive work effort associated with the MSHCP. The drafting and negotiating of the IA involves eight co-permittees (ECPO members), three environmental NGOs, FWS, technical consultants, legal consultants, and other stakeholders within the MSHJCP area. The estimated costs reflect the number of parties involved, the number of covered species (12), the size and complexity of the MSHCP, and the logistics of negotiating a long-term (50 year) Implementing

Agreement that is acceptable to all parties. Due to the complexity and uniqueness of this MSHCP, the draft IA will require a large amount of original text that will be drafted by the applicant's legal consultant. The budget assumes 80 hours of conferences calls amongst the parties to the IA negotiations, and four (4) all day meetings in Naples or Vero Beach, Florida.

An overview of the project activities for FY2013 is provided in Table 2. A more detailed breakdown of estimated costs and the applicant match can be found in Table 3.

Given the large total cost of the MSHCP effort, ECPO cannot expend the full amount required to bring the MSHCP into its final review stages. The FY2013, if fully funded as shown in Table 3, will push the Eastern Colllier MSHCP into its final stages, securing major conservation actions for the Florida panther and the 11 other covered species.

RANKING CRITERIA SUMMARY

<u>Species Benefits</u>: This grant application supports development of a multispecies HCP to include 12 covered species (as listed on the eventual permit; Table 1), including the endangered Florida panther. As a wide-ranging species, panther protection and recovery require the planning of conservation and conservation measures on a landscape scale. By establishing this regional MSHCP, large swaths of habitat and wildlife corridors can be protected to benefit to the Florida panther, and to benefit the 11 other covered species that occupy the landscape matrix needed to support panther. The two non-listed species covered under the permit, white-tailed deer and feral hog, provide the primary prey base for panther.

The MSHCP will protect habitat within a portion of the panther's core population area. In the context of climate change, the Florida Natural Area Inventory (FNAI) has estimated that "The Florida panther (*Puma concolor coryi*) would lose about 15% of current habitat with 1 meter of

sea level rise and up to half with a rise of 3 meters" (FNAI, 2011; Atlas of Florida's Natural Heritage; http://www.fnai.org/PDF/Atlas Climate Change.pdf). The MSHCP area (Figure 1) occurs on a regional topographic high known as the Immokalee Rise, with elevations ranging from 4-15 meters (13-45 feet) above current sea level. This area of relatively high land is therefore important for long-term conservation of the core panther population, whether under current or future climate (sea level rise) scenarios.

<u>Ecosystem Benefits</u>: The 177,000± acre MSHCP area (Figure 1) contains a diverse mix of native habitats (upland forests, wetland forests, herbaceous wetlands, and dry prairies) occurring as a landscape matrix with agricultural fields, ranchlands, and compact developments. The MSHCP proposes that approximately 132,000± acres of native habitats and agricultural lands be protected to provide large swaths of interconnected habitats that support the 12 covered species.

The native habitats within the MSHCP area require minimal management and contain all of the natural occurring biotic and abiotic factors necessary for a fully functioning ecosystem. Indeed, it is the vastness, diversity, and quality of the natural ecosystems that have long supported panthers in the first place. The interspersed agricultural fields and ranchlands also provide support for most of the covered species, and actually serve as primary habitat for the northern crested caracara.


Fostering HCP Partnerships: ECPO itself is comprised of eight stakeholders who are large property owners. The history of the RLSA and MSHCP processes has been a hallmark of open dialogue and partnering between the ECPO property owners, environmental NGOs, other property owners within the MSHCP area, state and local governments, and business interests. At a minimum, stakeholders include the eight ECPO property owners, three major environmental NGOs (Defenders of Wildlife, Florida Wildlife Federation, and Audubon of Florida), an unknown number of property owners within the MSHCP area, the Gulf Citrus Growers, and the Greater Naples Chamber of Commerce (13 stakeholders minimum). The Implementing Agreement will contain provisions for a "Certificate of Participation," similar to some California HCPs, that will allow other property owners within the MSHCP area to participate after issuance of the Incidental Take Permit. Multiple endorsement letters from various stakeholders are included at the end of this document as Attachment 1.

<u>Delivery or Completion</u>: ECPO has demonstrated a strong commitment to pursuing the MSHCP process, and has coordinated closely with FWS. Significant initial steps in the MSHCP process have thus far been undertaken solely at ECPOs expense with the expressed purpose of following through the full implementation of the MSHCP. These past, current and future work

efforts demonstrate a clear commitment by ECPO to further the goals of panther and other listed species conservation via the MSHCP.

The discrete activities listed under the *Approach* section will effectively finalize the MSHCP planning process, as they will result in the delivery of a MSHCP document, a DEIS document, and an Implementing Agreement that are sufficient for review by the FWS Regional Office and Solicitor. The schedule for these discrete activities builds in sufficient review time for FWS, and anticipates delivery of the MSHCP, DEIS, and IA documents well before the end of 2014.

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Responses From Eastern Collier Property Owners to USFWS General Comments on the draft East Collier Multiple Species HCP (9/10/2015)

 The HCP does not include a discussion of roads needed to support the proposed development. We consider roads interrelated/interdependent activities that have to be analyzed.

The HCP covers roads that are interrelated/interdependent to the Covered Activities. These are roads that are internal to Covered Activities. Roads that are not controlled by applicants are not Covered Activities in the HCP. See pages 24, 54, 84-85, and 87 of the document for a discussion of roads.

• This document mentions the existing Rural Lands Stewardship Program (RLSP) but does not indicate which lands have already been protected as part of this program. Generally, the Service can't consider lands that have already been used for mitigation as mitigation for a second project unless a conservation benefit beyond what the original project provided is demonstrated. We recommend a more detailed discussion of the RLSP and how it fits into the HCP.

As recommended, applicants will address this point and provide a more detailed discussion of how the HCP relates to the RLSP in the next draft of the document.

• The eastern panther corridor is not well located and does not appear to be wide enough to be functional. Without a functional corridor, it appears the potential east-west development in that area could block movement of panthers north and south.

Applicants do not agree that the eastern panther corridor would have no functional value, but nonetheless are willing to consider additional information and suggestions as to the location and width of the corridor.

• The plan allows landowners to implement avoidance and minimization measures to reduce the PHUs required to mitigate their projects. While we generally prefer avoidance and minimization of impacts before mitigating for them, options available to each landowner will be specific to the landscape location of their project and existing development in the surrounding area. Avoidance and minimization may not be possible.

The landscape-scale planning involved in the HCP avoids impacts to species by clustering the lands available for Covered Activities and directing them toward areas with relatively little native habitat and little native habitat connectivity, much of which is already disturbed. See HCP at Figure 2-1 (HCP Land Designations map). Further minimization may be possible at the project-specific level. Applicants are willing to further discuss these issues at the appropriate time.

• The biological goals for panthers focus on habitat goals. There should be a goal focused on actual panther use of the plan area. Otherwise, due to the landscape scale of this plan and effects to panthers beyond habitat loss as indicated by the Panther Habitat Unit calculations, it is possible to meet habitat goals but reduce panther use of the habitat to a

degree that it no longer functions as it is intended.

The HCP preserves large areas of connected habitat that are utilized by panthers. Compare HCP Figure 2-1 (HCP Land Designations map) with HCP Figures 4-5 through 4-8 (Panther Radio Telemetry and GPS Data). Land designations under the HCP were designed to preserve and enhance land that can serve as corridors to facilitate panther movement through the HCP Area. The HCP therefore creates opportunity for panthers to use the HCP Area and enjoy additional conservation benefits (such as improved conditions in more important habitat areas), and available data indicate panthers are likely to use the area, but many factors affect panther movement that are beyond applicants' control. It would be inappropriate to apply a biological goal focused only on panther use of the area, and nothing in the ESA requires such a goal.

• The plan identifies Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) as the entity responsible for panther monitoring and indicates that the applicants will help fund the monitoring, if necessary. Has FWC been contacted about this role? How likely is it that FWC will have the funding to continue its programs? Is there an alternative plan if FWC discontinues monitoring?

FWC has conducted overall monitoring of panthers for many years and applicants anticipate that FWC's monitoring program will continue. This role is not specific to the HCP. The HCP addresses monitoring at pages 90-91.

• There is no adaptive management proposed for panthers (or other species) in the plan. As the main species for the plan, there should be adaptive management for panthers. It should be tied to a biological goal for panther use of the area. There is enough uncertainty about the exact types and locations of impacts that an adaptive management plan is warranted.

There is very little uncertainty under the HCP regarding the locations where impacts can occur. Lands within the HCP Area have been carefully designated for preservation and for Covered Activities. See HCP at Figure 2-1. Although the plan allows a limited amount of flexibility at this stage, Covered Activities can only occur within the 49,848-acre area designated for Covered Activities and will be capped at 45,000 acres, including the Town of Ave Maria, which has already been developed. Please see the HCP at pages 92-93 for a discussion of adaptive management. Please also see applicants' response above to the comment suggesting a biological goal based on panther use. Applicants are willing to work with the Service to identify specific sources of uncertainty and to address them.

• The plan indicates that no incidental take of caracara will occur despite the fact that five nests and a communal roost or "gathering area" occurs in or adjacent to covered activity areas. Additional discussion is needed about take of caracara.

The occurrence of caracara is highly dependent on land management practices. See discussion in HCP of caracara habitat use at pages 99-100. Applicants will provide additional discussion regarding potential impacts to and potential take of caracara in the next draft of the HCP.

Restoration for one species may not necessarily benefit another species in the mitigation area.
 For example, wetland restoration for wood storks may not be beneficial for panthers.
 Impacts associated with restoration or enhancement need to be accounted for within the mitigation area.

The HCP Area provides sufficient expanses of habitat for the Covered Species to preclude this possibility, but applicants are willing to consider additional information and suggestions.

• There are differences between the plan and recommendations from the Panther Review Team (PRT). The Service would like to discuss alternatives that are closer to PRT recommendations.

Please see the discussion in the HCP at pages 225-226 regarding applicants' reasons for not selecting the precise Panther Review Team (PRT) Configuration Alternative. Applicants are willing to consider additional information and suggestions.



We are proceeding with the planning of the Scoping Meeting for January 26 and need to nail down a couple of items. First, we will need an address to which people can email their comments. There are two options for this:

- 1. The Service provides an email address for receipt of all comments sent by email. The Corps of Engineers and the U.S. Coast Guard does this for their NEPA studies and it stems from their counsel saying that the federal agency must be the recipient of the comments. They then pass the comments on to the consultant for processing. My guess is that the Service has a similar requirement?

Hello all,

I checked with the RO and for "high reconnaissance" flights (above 500 feet except for landing

and take-off, and not over water) there are no training requirements. The real hang-up turned out to be the pilot and the aircraft- any aircraft and pilot taking FWS employees on-board, even for a site visit, has to be approved by DOI-OAS, and that process can take about 2 weeks. Given the sight visit is next week, Christian didn't really have time to submit the pilot and aircraft info for approval so he went ahead and cancelled the reconnaissance flight. The portion of the itinerary where the flight was previously scheduled will now be taken up by an expanded ground visit.

That said, while we were waiting for feedback from the RO and Christian I went ahead and knocked out the courses for aviation safety required, were the flight to have gone below 500 feet, and learned a lot from it. Based on what I learned we might want to look into bringing the water ditching class down here and running folks who haven't been through that training through it, as well as all of the basic aviation safety courses. We might want to also make sure all of the supervisors have the appropriate online-courses knocked out, too (come to find out supervisors need a different online training if any of their employees might end up flying...who knew!?). That way if something like this pops up in the future we're not caught off-guard.



Endangered Species Act (ESA)





- Law that protects and promotes the recovery of federally-listed threatened and endangered species
- The Service may issue permits to non-federal parties through processes described in Section 10 of the ESA
- "Incidental take" is the unintended take that may occur as a consequence of engaging in an otherwise lawful activity

Key Definitions

"Take" means to harass, harm, pursue, hunt, shoot, wound, kill, trap, capture, or collect any threatened or endangered species.

"Harm" may include significant habitat modification where it actually kills or injures a listed species through impairment of essential behavior.

Section 10 (a) Criteria

- The taking will be incidental;
- The applicant will, to the maximum extent practicable, minimize and mitigate the impact of such taking;
- The applicant will develop an HCP and ensure that adequate funding for the plan will be provided;
- The taking will not appreciably reduce the likelihood of the survival and recovery of the species in the wild; and
- The applicant will carry out any other measures that the Secretary of the Interior may require as being necessary or appropriate for the purposes of the HCP.

The U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service's Role in this Process





- The Service is providing technical assistance to the applicants and reviewing the Eastern Collier Multiple Species HCP to ensure issuance of an Incidental Take Permit under Section 10(a)(1)(B) of the ESA, to the applicants, will not jeopardize the survival and recovery of federally-listed species.
- The Service is providing technical assistance to the applicants and reviewing the Eastern Collier Multiple Species HCP to ensure issuance of an Incidental Take Permit under Section 10(a)(1)(B) of the ESA, to the applicants, will not lead to the listing of other species of conservation concern.

Process Overview

- 1. The Eastern Collier Property Owners have developed a draft HCP to support a future ITP application. The draft HCP has been submitted to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (May 2015) for review.
- 2. The Service is preparing a Draft EIS for public review that details potential impacts of the ITP and HCP. After public comment, the Final EIS will be published and the Service will prepare a Record of Decision (ROD).
- 3. If the Service determines that the Final HCP meets the ESA Section 10(a) criteria, the Service will issue the ITP.

- HCPs are planning documents required as part of an application for an incidental take permit. HCPs describe the action and how it may result in incidental take of federally listed threatened and endangered species; and how potentially adverse effects will be avoided, minimized, or mitigated by the applicant.
- HCPs can apply to both listed and nonlisted species, including those that are candidates or have been proposed for listing.





- has a cause and effect relationship with the proposed action or alternatives;

- has not been decided by law, regulation, or previous decision;
- and is amenable to scientific analysis rather than conjecture.
