Subject: further discussion on GBCS needed

Hey Jodie – just got off the phone with Katrina, and was reminded that we still need further discussion to clarify the CS access standard – what it is, when it applies, and what is the appropriate baseline to measure compliance with the standard. It would also be good to continue to discuss the effects of activities in subunits that have improved beyond 1998 (not those identified as in need...) At what point can we reasonably expect adverse effects to occur, when there's a wide range of potential impacts (0 – 15,000 acres). Finally, we still haven't had a chance to talk about how OMARD and TMARD fit into the CS; i.e. is secure habitat really the only metric necessary to state as a standard, while only requiring monitoring for OMARD and TMARD? What about outside the rz/pca where the only requirement is to monitor changes in secure? How does that measure up against the findings in Schwartz et al 2010? Should we schedule another conference call to try to get at some of these issues?



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
