Matt,

Your answers are below:

- Is the March 2007 Conservation Strategy the most up to date version? It says we will update every 5 years so just wanted to make sure I had the most recent doc. **Yes. Since delisting was overturned in 2009, the CS was never updated until now with what we are doing for the next proposed delisting.**
- The 2013 revised recovery criteria document looks different from the 2007 document. Where specifically in the 2007 document does it call for a stable/increasing population? **In the CS Appendix C (p. 126) first bullet in the middle of the page.**
- Do you have a color map that shows the old DMA vs the new proposed DMA? There was never "an old DMA". **There was an old "Conservation Strategy Management Area" (the purple line on the attached map) where we counted mortalities. We used the suitable habitat line as the area where we would count both the population and the mortalities, thereby shrinking the area where we counted mortalities by 17,497 square miles. The states were in full agreement with this.**
- What is the difference between the PCA and the DMA? Did we just update the term? **The PCA is the recovery zone (black line on the attached map) while the DMA is the grizzly bear suitable habitat in the ecosystem (red line on the attached map).**
- Do you have a copy of the 15 member public roundtable comments that the 3 governors made on the Conservation Strategy? **These are attached.**
