Subject: GYE Grizzly Delisting

Dear Mountain-Prairie Region:

During the last three decades, the grizzly bear population in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem of Montana, Wyoming and Idaho has increased from as few as 136 bears, when they were listed under the ESA in 1975, to an estimated 700 or more bears today. Today, the Service announced a proposal to delist the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem population of grizzly bears. This proposed delisting only affects the Yellowstone grizzly bear population. All other populations of grizzly bears in the lower 48 states will remain listed under the Endangered Species Act. You can review the proposed rule, draft conservation strategy, and other associated documents on our website at <http://www.fws.gov/mountain-prairie/es/grizzlybear.php>.

We recognize that there will be a high level of interest regarding this proposal, both inside and outside of our agency. In an effort to provide all Region 6 employees an opportunity to learn more about the proposed delisting and ask any questions you may have, we will be hosting an all-employee conference call on Monday, March 7th at 11:00 a.m. MT.
