OFFICER (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) reports:

On 11/24/13 at approximately 1400 hours, I, Conservation Officer (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) received a call from (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), who is a trapper in the Finland area. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) said that he thinks that there is a Lynx in one of his traps. As soon as he saw the cat, he said that he left the woods to get to a phone to call a Game Warden. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) told me the location was about eight miles west on the Heffelfinger road from Finland. I contacted my supervisor and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to notify them of the incidental catch. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated to me that the Lynx project has expired so he does not respond to Lynx calls anymore. I also left a voicemail and sent an email to (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), US Fish and Wildlife service.

I met (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) in Finland around 1800 hours and he described the cat in question and gave me the location, T. 58 N- R. 9W Sec. 36. We then drove out to that location. As we approached the area of the trap, I saw the cat. I identified it as a Lynx. It looked healthy and unharmed. I took photos of the cat and as I approached it, it became aggressive. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and I released the Lynx according to the MN DNR guidelines sent from my supervisor. As the trap was released, the Lynx ran in the opposite direction of me and appeared unharmed from the trap. I conducted a license check of (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and trap inspection. The trap was in compliance with the Lynx management zone regulations.
