This one is easy... That is because there is no open trapping season or hunting season on wolverines in those management units in the Okanagan (Region 8) or South Coast (Region 2). There is only a trapping season for wolverines in the Kootenay (Region 4, the eastern half of the southern part of the province), which is the reason why there is reported harvest there.
