> Hello Jens - Bob Inman recommended you as a contact in Sweden for questions about the wolverine.

>

> A bit of background: I am a biologist with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and have been assigned to work on our agency's listing determination for the wolverine (lower 48 states). As you are probably aware, a federal court vacated and remanded back to our agency our proposed rule (from 2014) to withdraw our previous proposed rule (2013) to list the species as threatened under the U.S. Endangered Species Act.

> We are preparing a new status review for the species and I have been tasked with

preparing a status assessment report that will be used to support our next listing determination (either warranted for listing or another withdrawal).

>

> I have been busy reviewing background information and previous studies, as well as newer studies/publications, including the 2016 paper that you coauthored with Maria Aronsson, and would like to speak with you about habitat suitability modeling, among other topics.

>

> A phone call would be easier to discuss specifics, so please let me know if you are available next week. I am in California, so I believe you are about 9 hours ahead of me. I am generally at work by 7:15 am Pacific Standard Time, so perhaps first thing in the morning (my time) would be an appropriate time to reach you.
