All records I could build from Uintas was 2008 - on.

The accuracy distance in meters in my "Input" filed is what I came up with based on the mapping I had to do with hard copies that I georeferenced or from a email that described the location.

No mention of camera records in any of the data provide, as the info was very limited and the contact at the Wasatch Forest had to dig around and get info for other rangers and such.

Note the GIS-ID filed that I created, that tracks the hard copy records that we have just in case.
