Kit and Dan,

Scheduling the in person meeting on wolverine is proving difficult. And finding a time that works for everyone and aligns w/ a meeting w/ NOAA to discuss the climate study, even more difficult. Rather than push a meeting out further to accommodate schedules, we are electing to have a small group meet in Denver, probably Feb 15-16.

Attending will be the lead biologist Betty, myself, John from our decision support branch, maybe Marj. I would like to have the lead from each of your regions join if possible. Please let me know who that would be and I will get in touch with them. I'm assuming Bryon Holt for R1, and Josh Hull for R8?? I think one representative from each region is plenty for this meeting.

We plan to provide a detailed update to the rest of the FWS wolverine group after the meeting so everyone knows where the analysis is headed.

Attached is a more detailed timeline of milestones for the wolverine SSA/Listing determination schedule than what was provided in the project plan. This was recently produced for our RD's office. We will need to stick to this schedule as closely as possible, there isn't much room for error.

Betty has been busily sifting through the information that is coming in and beginning to build the foundation of our analysis. We have had some discussions in R6 about the shape that analysis could take given the information and time we have. We have some ideas, but no clear direction on that front yet. We will keep you informed as things progress. Our next SSA Core Team call is in two weeks and we'll provide more info on progress at that time.

The NOAA climate/snow modeling study is moving along, we may have results from them in Feb.

We had intentions of getting a small group of core teamers together in Denver for a few days in mid-Feb.; looking like late Feb early March might be more realistic.
